2024 Spring Conference (excerpts from the minutes of D/Lt/C Linda Lewis, AP)

Chief Commander's Message

The Chief Commander's representative, N/Fl/Lt Randy Stow, JN-IN introduced a video from our Chief Commander, Ralph A. Bernard, AP. The C/C spoke of some of the new initiatives National is making. These include new IT software which will support our Membership records, new branding for marketing USPS in the hopes of increasing membership, and continued changes and improvements in course materials. He would like us to get more involved in civic events. A new Executive Director for the Headquarters staff has been hired and will start in April.

Program: P/D/Lt/C Clifford McKibbin, SN introduced our guest speaker, Walter "Wally" Banzhaf, a retired Hartford professor and former Navy Underwater Sound Lab engineer. On January 5, 1969, Wally along with 11 other men boarded the *Sea Surveyor*, an Electric Boat research vessel, to test a new radio detection system for subs. They were supposed to rendezvous with the *USS Greenling*, 270 miles south of Nantucket. They soon encountered 25' waves and 50+ mph winds, air temperature in the 30s and water temperatures in the 40s. The *Sea Surveryor* apparently hit something around midnight on the 6th and the men were only saved by the quick action of the Captain who ordered 'Abandon Ship' within minutes. The radio man was only able to send a quick MAYDAY with, unfortunately, a longitude that was off by several degrees. The USCG could never find them. All 12 men were able to jump into a 15 man life raft. The gale force winds and wave action capsized their life raft throwing the men into the water but they were all able to get back inside. There was a light on top of the life raft and there was also a flash light as part of survival supplies that they used to try and attract the attention of passing vessels of which there were very few. Ultimately, their light was seen on January 8th at 2 a.m. by a Norwegian freighter carrying coal to Holland. Once aboard, the men were treated royally with clean and dry clothes, food, and drink as they traveled on to Rotterdam arriving on January 18. They flew to JFK on January 19 to be greeted by family and friends. These men certainly had many near death experiences and were very lucky to be alive. Wally was a great presenter combining a bit of humor along the way.

Education Presentation: D/Lt/C Arthur Andrea, AP gave a power point presentation on some of the new requirements for Vessel Safety Checks.

Approval of the audit and next year's budget. The Audit Report for 2023-24 was read and the Conference voted to approve it. D/Lt/C Peter Jenkin, SN then presented the draft budget for the fiscal year 2024-25 and the Conference voted to approve it.

Election of Officers. The slate of Officers for 2024-25 presented in the Spring *Sounds of 1* with the addition of P/D/Lt/C Barbara Huber, AP of the Springfield Squadron as Asst. Treasurer was read by the Nominating Chair. N/Fl/Lt Randy Stow, JN-IN then carried out the election and installation of the Bridge.



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2022 U.S. Coast Guard Boating Statistics

- The fatality rate was 5.4 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels based on 4,040 accidents involving 636 deaths and 2,222 injuries. This rate represents a 1.8% decrease from the 2021 fatality rate.
- Property damage totaled more than \$63 million.
- Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents; where the primary cause was known, it was listed as the leading factor in 16% of deaths.
- Where cause of death was known, 75% of fatal boating accident victims drowned. Of those drowning victims with reported life jacket usage, 85% were not wearing a life jacket.
- Where length was known, three out of every four boaters who drowned were using vessels less than 21 feet in length.
- Where instruction was known, 74% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction.
- There were 173 accidents in which at least one person was struck by a propeller. Collectively, these accidents resulted in 41 deaths and 182 injuries.
- Operator inattention, operator inexperience, improper lookout, excessive speed, and machinery failure rank as the top five primary contributing factors in accidents.
- The most common vessel types involved in reported accidents were open motorboats (47%), personal watercraft (18%), and cabin motorboats (14%). Where data was known, the vessel types with the highest percentage of deaths were open motorboats (47%), kayaks (14%), and personal watercraft and pontoons at 9% each.
