Off in the distance you could see a myriad of dinghy sailboats seemingly to dance on the water—pivoting here and there—ebbing and flowing in perfect harmony.

Our marks were for the keel boat sailing vessels. It was fascinating to see them round the marks in a precise counterclockwise direction and then hoist up their spinnaker sail to maximize their wind speed. There is an art and there is a science and it is all extra-ordinary.

After the race, complimentary cookout of hamburgers, hot dogs, sides and condiments was available. Beverages, including beer and wine, were offered at no charge. All of these goodies were donated from co-sponsors of the event. 

Bridge Reports

Safety Report

What Causes Capsizes

All boats can capsize under the right conditions. Instability causes boats to capsize. Boats are inherently stable until something causes them to become unstable. And that something is "weight" — where it is and how much it is determines when a boat will tip over far enough to capsize or fill with water.

A capsize is defined as a boat rolling over onto its side or completely over; swamping typically means that a boat fills with water but remains floating. Nearly all capsizes can be

assigned one of three causes.

Weight - The most common is too much weight or poorly distributed weight.

Leaks – Leaks can be caused by such things as forgetting to put the drain plug in or leaking fittings.

Weather – Small boats are easily overwhelmed by modest waves or even wake, especially when the boat is loaded and sitting low in the water.

Life jackets can buy extra time until you're rescued, but they have to be worn.
