


Independence Day Dock Party was a Hit

Mark 29 August 2015 on your calendar NOW! The GLSPS Boat Rally is only one month away. It has been planned and the course is being checked. The Rally will start at Wolf Creek Launch and finish at the boat dock of Marcia and Gene Pett on the main lake.

The course is of a similar length to the past events. You will be given a set of instructions giving a direction to go and clues to look for on the shore. After finding each clue the course is once again defined either by compass heading or towards some land mark. Questions are asked about each clue that will allow the rally master to know if you really did find the clue. The route will take you into some areas of Grand Lake which you may not have visited in the past. However, the ability to read a chart will be helpful. As in the past, don't plan on following the boat ahead of you as they may be going on a different route in another direction.

At the end of the rally lunch will be provided. If you would like to bring a snack or dessert such as cookies or brownies to share it would be appreciated. I will take these from you at Wolf Creek so you will not have to carry them in your boat during the rally. NO drinks provided please bring your own.



What's needed to participate include:

- *a desire to see another part of the lake
- *a boat captained by a member of GLSPS or USPS
- *a current GRDA/USPS vessel exam sticker Contact Jay Spicer at 918-791-8341now if you have not done this yet.
- *at least four people in each boat

Recently I sent out surveys to determine the members' level of interest in taking any of the courses, electives and/or seminars. The results were quite disappointing as less than one percent responded and the ones that did respond indicated a variety of courses they might be interest in. Unfortunately the interest level was scattered where no course had an interest level greater than three persons and most the level was one person. With that in mind we'll try again in the fall after the boating season.

National United States Power Squadrons has made another change regarding seminars. They now want to charge a \$10.00 administrative fee for each person taking a seminar for the purpose of handling the data input into their system. There will not be a change if a member wants to take the seminar without having it recorded on the database at National headquarters.

As previously reported, the United States Power Squadron, America's Boating Course 3 (ABC3) as of August 1st is no longer accredited by NASBLA. Therefore, according to them no squadron may teach that course until such time as they meet and have approved the following conditions. (1) A Power Point presentation of the items and criteria for teaching boating safety must be submitted for approval. Additionally there may be only one Power Point for use by all squadrons in a state. Both Grand Lake and Oklahoma City submitted presentations, and they are different. National will evaluate and select the one they believe to be the best. (2) A set of questions and the answers for the Oklahoma portion of the examination are to be submitted for approval. Both squadrons have submitted their questions but like the presentations, there are differences. However Grand Lake's is approved by the State of Oklahoma. And (3) there must be a Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Oklahoma and the squadron allowing the squadron to teach boating safety. Grand Lake has such a memorandum. National will first have to consolidate or seek a common ground between Grand Lake's and Oklahoma City's squadrons' submissions where there are differences. Once done, National will notify all squadrons within each state as to the approval or disapproval of their materials and grant or deny their ability to continue to teach the boating course. With all that being said it is now a matter of "wait and see." As has been said in the past, any person that is interested in a course may take it through self-study. Just let me know and I'll get the books and materials to you.

Did You Know?

80% of all lightning is within a cumulonimbus cloud or between them. It is called sheet lightning. The most dangerous and dramatic lightning strikes are those that strike the surface. The electrical discharge is enormous, about 100 million volts. The flash is really a series of 3 or 4 strokes separated by about 50 milliseconds. The discharge heats the surrounding air then quickly cools causing sound waves or thunder.

By dividing the time (number of seconds) between the flash and the first sound of thunder by 5, the distance in miles from the lightning can be estimated. Remember the National Weather Service rule of 30/30. Seek shelter if the delay between the lightning flash and the thunder is 30 seconds or less. Remain in the shelter for 30 minutes after the last thunderclap.

Carrots

Ingredients:

1# bag sliced frozen carrots

½ C. Water

3 T Brown sugar

2 T Butter

2 T Cornstarch



1 # bag of sliced frozen carrots cooked in about ½ cup water with 3T brown sugar and 2T butter. When carrots are tender add a mixture of 2T cornstarch which has been mixed in 1/4 cup of water.

Note: If there isn't enough juice left in the carrots after cooking them, just add a little water and carefully add some of the cornstarch mixture.
