The Grand Lake Association (GLA) and the Grand Lake Sail & Power Squadron (GLSPS) - what is our relationship? GLA's role is to promote the Grand Lake tourism industry. Businesses pay the GLA to advertise their goods, attractions, and services. The GLA does this by maintaining the Visitor's Center on N. 59 Hwy in Grove, by publishing an annual Visitor's Guide, by providing an area for display of informational material that visitors can take with them, and by sponsoring/promoting various community events, e.g. Pelican Fest. *Because Power Squadron members volunteer to staff the Visitor's Center in the summer we don't have to pay for the GLA's services.* In addition, GLSPS gets to use the Visitors' Center meeting rooms for our classes, E-Board meetings, and other GLSPS committee meetings. (If you have tried to find a place to hold a meeting in Grove, you'll understand why this is a major perk.)

Bottom line- volunteering to help visitors discover the Grand Lake area is beneficial to Lake businesses, beneficial to the Squadron, and can be personally gratifying as well! When adding an electrical device to your boat be sure that the stranded wire from the device is fitted with a properly- sized terminal lug to make the connection to the power source. Stranded wire itself is not suitable for securing wire to a screw or bolt. Terminal lugs are available for crimping or soldering. If crimped or pressure-bolted connections are not made with a ratcheting type crimp tool, the wires should be soldered at the wire terminal to provide a better joint. Never use twist-on connectors (wire nuts) to avoid corrosion and loosening due to vibration on boats. When soldering always use rosin-core solder to avoid corrosion.



Newer VHF radios can be purchased with a feature called Digital Selective Calling (DSC). The primary goals of the Digital Selective Calling system are to improve the reception and identification of distress calls and to eliminate hoax distress calls. The minimum standard DSC transceiver provides automatic transmission of distress messages, complete with the identification and the position of the calling vessel. Depending on the type of boating you do but especially coastal boating or off-shore, a VHF radio with DSC may be the radio of choice.



Buying a boat requires several questions to be answered such as what type and style will best serve your planned use of the boat. Will you be on larger lakes like Grand Lake, smaller lakes or rivers? Some boats are designed for more protected waters. How many people do you plan to take on your boat? Smaller boats have capacity and weight limits. Larger boats are often yacht certified allowing more capacity.

Other factors that should be considered other than the initial expense are operational, maintenance and storage expenses. These will all vary as to type of boat you have chosen to enjoy.
