

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The Coastal Rendezvous and Cooperating Charting Event this September near Beaufort, NC offer a culturally rich in history opportunity to share with each other. How much do you really know about our North Carolina southern Outer Banks and Crystal Coast?

This area may be the reason that I joined the Power Squadron. My family visited this area and Ocracoke many times when I was young. My dad first put me overboard at the jetty at Cape Lookout to skin dive. This jetty has much marine life including an occasional spiny lobster typical of Florida. The area offers world class scuba diving due to numerous wrecks. Many of the wrecks are due to German submarines sinking ships off our coast during World War II. To also get to some fishing spots, I needed to improve my navigation skills. This area has shallow, inland sounds and the waters off the coast have shoals extending out of sight of land. The Power Squadron courses that I completed helped me personally enjoy and share this area of the coastal Carolinas with family and friends.

It is a little bit longer trek to travel to the Morehead City Beaufort area than some of the trips we take but it can be one of the most rewarding areas for its history, museums, beaches, boating/fishing and just plain fun. We have visited this area as a Squadron many times - District Rendezvous, Cooperative Charting trip with our Coastal Rendezvous and even a fall boat camping trip. Our last visit as a group was in 2014.



Located along the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway and also having a deep port, this area has attracted sailors for centuries. Some of the first non-native inhabitants were the wild horses, possibly from wrecked ships along the coast. These animals still roam Shackleford banks and Carrot Island across from Beaufort, NC. With commerce moving along our coast pirates scavenged a living along our coast. The ship, Queen Anne's Revenge, believed to be that of the pirate known as Blackbeard, was found beneath the waves of Beaufort Inlet in 1996. Civil war history can also be found at Fort Macon overlooking that same Beaufort Inlet.

Thriving whaling and fishing communities existed along Shackleford Banks. Seventy-five families lived there at Diamond City, Belle's Island, Wade's Shore, Whale Creek and the Mullet Pond. The tough life of living on an island with strong storms and mosquitoes tested the toughest people. Due to hurricanes in the late 1800's, these communities dissolved away with people moving to Harkers Island, Beaufort, "the Promised Land" at Morehead City, and Salter Path along Bogue sound.



A hurricane in the 1930s separated what is now Shackleford Banks from the area where the Cape Lookout Lighthouse (completed 1859) is located and created Barden Inlet.



Many people wonder why the Cape Lookout lighthouse has the diamond shape and yet Diamond Shoals are located off Cape Hatteras. Diamond City would be another guess, but that community located near the now Barden Inlet, was named for the Cape Lookout lighthouse diamond pattern. The diamonds on the lighthouse also have a certain alignment. The centers of the black diamonds are aligned north-south and the centers of the white diamonds are aligned east-west. So, depending on which diamonds you see, you have a relative direction from the lighthouse.

The area from Portsmouth Island, south to Cape Lookout and west along Shackleford Banks to Beaufort Inlet is the Cape Lookout National Seashore. We hope to be able to arrange over the water trips to Shackleford Banks and to the Cape Lookout area. There are open passenger ferries that run to both of these locations. (Take your foul weather gear.) We also have our own boats which may make the trek. The Coast Guard has removed a portion of the buoys that marked the channel from Harkers Island to Barden Inlet due to severe shoaling. However, the ferry service is still going to the cape. We might have a new DEWDA (Draft Exceeds Water Depth Available) award given this year. In good weather a direct route from Beaufort Inlet through the open ocean is possible.

Either way, the commander is excited that about choosing this location because of the attractions in the area, good seafood available, and planned socials. (He might want me to cook shrimp for everyone also.)

### **Predicted Log Contest and Training**

Enjoy two days at Merit Mark Point on Lake Wylie - Predicted log training and competition day.

<u>What is a Predicted Log Contest?</u> - The Predicted Log Contest pits your navigation knowledge and skippering skills against the clock. We do this as a friendly competition amongst ourselves and also in competition for the "**Pride of Lake Wylie**" trophy with the Catawba Sail and Power Squadron. Three lowest scores in each squadron are used to determine who gets the trophy.

**Predicted Log Training** - Training / Review for the Predicted Log Contest is **Sunday, June 5th at 1100 hrs.** (11:00 a.m.) at Merit Mark Point. No experience is necessary as we will have some of us ready to help and explain how to do it. Bring a lake chart/map, calculator, dividers, pencil, eraser, paper and whatever else you feel you may need for navigation.

Basically, the competition deals with Speed, Time, and Distance.  $(60xD = S \times T)$  How closely can you predetermine the time it will take to travel each leg of a course to specified locations? Compare that **predicted time** to the **actual time** recorded doing the actual run of the course in a boat with an observer/timekeeper. The distance is measured off a chart. Speed is up to the operator/competitor but the only speed reference instrument allowed during the competition is a tachometer. (No GPS or speedometer allowed.) Time is calculated.

The score keeper tabulates how close your **predicted time** was to the **actual time** observed on each leg and calculates a single total error. The person and squadron with the lowest error are declared the winners of the competition.

**Predicted Log Competition** - Competition is the following Saturday, June 11<sup>th</sup>. Starting at 0900, (9:00 a.m.) Competition ends in the early afternoon so get there early. This activity is available to all members with or without a boat. If you do not

have a boat, other members usually have their boats available to share.

Note that we need three (3) competitors from our squadron to compete in this competition or we may forfeit our chance to win back "The Pride of Wylie" trophy.

Competing against yourself and comparing your skills to those of other boaters is a fun, friendly competition that hones your boat-handling skills learned in our basic navigation classes.

We are the host squadron for the first D27 Rendezvous in three years. It is going to be held at the Red Fez Club on Lake Wylie and at 2 other venues in the Kingsley area in Fort Mill, SC. We want to make sure that Charlotte makes D27 proud by hosting a great, fun time.

Many people have already volunteered to help with specific tasks related to the Rendezvous (thanks to all), but we still have some roles that we need to fill to make certain that the event is a success.

Here are the key roles we still need to fill:

- **50/50 Lead(s)** Sell 50 / 50 "raffle" tickets during Friday registration as people arrive, the Friday night reception, and the main picnic event on Saturday, and then announce the winner Saturday afternoon near the close of events at the Red Fez Club. We have a person to do this on Friday night; we need another person to do it on Saturday. In a 50/50 "raffle", the winner is determined via a drawing; the winner and D27 will split the pot of monies raised via the ticket sales (the D27 portion helps to fund the Rendezvous)

### New Fire Extinguisher Regulations and New Labeling for Vessels

New fire extinguisher regulations go into effect April 20, 2022. These new regulations may mean that many of our vessels will not be complying with the rules after April 20th, 2022. There are also some traps that I will help guide you through.

### Primary Regulation Changes:

1) <u>Disposable</u> (non-rechargeable) fire extinguishers must not be more than 12 years old according to the date of manufacture stamped on the cylinder. Remove any extinguishers not meeting this requirement from the vessel.

2) <u>New Labeling</u>. - The labeling in not actually new. The USCG has dropped the B-I, B-II labeling and adopted the UL classification already being used and already on your extinguishers. See the new labeling and requirements for fire extinguishers listed below from the BoatUS Foundation:

NEW: Vessel Length and Fire Extinguisher Type Table

Vessel Length	No Fixed System	With approved Fixed Systems
Less than 26'	1 B-1/5-B/10-B	0
26' to less than 40'	2 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B	1 B-1/5-B/10-B
40' to 65'	3 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B and 1 B-1/5-B/10-B	2 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B

Goes into effect April 20, 2022

Trap #1 - Rechargeable extinguishers must be serviced/maintained and tagged annually by a qualified technician. (Fixed systems are typically this type.) Most of us use a USCG Approved B-I (10-B rated) fire extinguisher. Why use a rechargeable fire extinguisher when a disposable one is good for 12 years after the date of manufacture? Source: USCGBoating.org, FAQ about fire extinguisher requirements. Question #13. Answer #13: "The date of manufacturing on a rechargeable fire extinguisher is printed on the label of the bottle. The first National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) certified inspection is due one year from the date of manufacturing and the bottle tag must indicate this inspection. A rechargeable does not need to be removed from service after 12 years, but it instead must be maintained annually by a technician."

**<u>Trap #2</u>** - Be sure your extinguisher or replacement is what you think it is. Do not assume your fire extinguisher is good or in serviceable and working order. Do not be caught with an out-of-date rechargeable unit. Disposable and rechargeable fire extinguishers also look very similar. At Lowes, all the fire extinguishers (First Alert brand) with a 10-B:C rating were **<u>Rechargeable</u>**. At Home Depot, all the fire extinguishers (Kidde brand) with a 10-B:C rating were **Disposable**.) I had to pull these new fire extinguishers out of a new box to determine which type I was holding. One indicator is to read the label about what to do with it after it is discharged (even with a little discharge) or the gauge is not in the operating area. If it has "recharge" as an option, it is rechargeable. Otherwise, it is a disposable and you need to remove it from service and dispose of it. (Do not leave it on the boat.).

<u>Summary</u> - None of the web sites below tell the whole story efficiently or effectively. In a nut shell:

- USGC has adopted the existing UL fire extinguisher ratings. (No more B-I, B-II) 5-B or 20-B units required. (ex. B-10 meets the 5-B requirement). Extinguisher must still be "USCG Approved".
- Rechargeable units typically are not limited to the 12year service life. However, disposable (nonrechargeable) units make the most economic sense for the recreational boater.
- Units must be inspected (Rechargeable unit requires annual certified inspection.)
- Disposable units to be removed from service after 12 years based on the manufacture date (on bottom of cylinder).
- Units must be in Good and Serviceable working condition.

Rechargeable units need annual inspection and tag by a certified person. I am buying a disposable, non-rechargeable extinguisher units for less than \$20 to avoid having an annual service/tag made each year. (Typically, 10-B:C or 1A:B-10:C rated)




