



TO: ABC-Charlotte, Charlotte Power Squadron DATE: 9 January 2023

ABC-Charlotte has had a very good squadron year. We accomplished the goals set at the COW to "Make Ship Happen – Friendship, Membership, Stewardship." Throughout the year we were able to:

- · Hold 8 membership meetings with a variety of programs
- Hold 11 ExCom meetings
- Search for and evaluate three restaurants as standard membership meeting locations
- Host a booth at the Mid Atlantic Boat Show without partnering with other squadrons
- Send representatives to both D27 Council / Conferences and both National Meetings
- Teach 4 ABC classes, instructing 55 students
- Through transfers, reinstatements, and new members gained via ABC classes, increase membership from 89 to at one point 102
- Represent our squadron in the Waxhaw July 4 parade
- Hold our annual Chicken-Q and Fall BBQ events at Merit Mark Point
- Hold a very successful Children's Outing with Catawba Sail and Power Squadron, with over 300 children and counselors in attendance
- Host the D27 Rendezvous, declared by the D/C as one of the best
- · Have fun at the Commander's Picnic
- Celebrate the holidays at a very successful Christmas Party
- Try out new events, like Lunch at the Lake at Merit Mark Point, the Catawba Queen cruise, and rowing on the Executive Officer's boat
- Perform co-operative charting at the Morehead City Coastal Rendezvous, 7 earning honor roll
- Restart the Predicted Log contest
- Communicate via emails, 10 issues of the Side Lights and the Roster
- Successfully raise money via 50/50's and AutoBell card sales
- Revise a new set of bylaws, the first revision since 2003, with Life Members gracefully agreeing to pay squadron dues avoiding a dues increase
- Have 41 members earn Merit Marks, with three people reaching Life or Emeritus status
- Update our financial reporting and end the year with a surplus over our planned budget
- Unfortunately lose 3 members that crossed the bar

As Commander, I attended/led all except three of the events mentioned above (the May membership meeting, the Waxhaw Parade, and 1 Lunch at the Lake) and led the D27 Rendezvous effort. Education Officer's Annual Report

TO: ABC-Charlotte, Charlotte Power Squadron DATE: 9 January 2023

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as the Squadron Education Officer (SEO) of America's Boating Club - Charlotte for this past year. With most in person educational previously slowed down due to Covid-19, we did have a further increase in educational activities this year.

This year the Education Department:

- Modified and relaxed Covid protocol implemented earlier and conducted the ABC classes in North and South Carolina.
- Scheduled and conducted four (4) ABC classes. One class was conducted at Victory Lanes Karting in north Charlotte to access students in northern Mecklenburg County previously served by Lake Norman Sail and Power Squadron. The other three classes were conducted at MarineMax Hall Marine Lake Wylie.
- A total of 55 students took these one-day classes with 50 students successful completing the course. Class size ranged from a low of 6 students to a high of 26 students. Students that successfully completed the course by South Carolina protocol have their names entered into the SC Department of Natural Resources data base and are eligible for a SC DNR issued Boating Education Card.
- Students passing our course this year exceeded the 39 students that passed last year.

As SEO I performed the following duties:

- Attended and gave reports at most Squadron Membership meetings and monthly Executive Committee meetings.
- Processed orders for educational materials for the planned ABC classes.
- Performed clerical duties and taught at our ABC classes.
- Authored two bridge messages for Side Lights

In addition to performing my duties as SEO, I attended/participated in or will attend/participate in by the end of the organization year, the following events:

- America's Boating Club Charlotte 2022 Annual Meeting / Change of Watch
- America's Boating Club National Annual Meeting Ponte Verda, Fla
- America's Boating Club District 27 Annual Meeting Cary, NC
- Participated At the District 27 Rendezvous Lake Wylie and headed a Geodetic Marker Recovery outing during that same event.
- Summer, lunch and get-together at Merit Mark Point


