Why take USPS courses? Why become an USPS member? The answers are many and varied. Let me suggest a few reasons.

"Why should I take the ABC course rather than the State course?" you may be asked. The State course teaches you safety afloat and the State laws. All important, but that's not all you need to learn. Suppose we taught people how to get a driver's license without teaching them how to drive. That is the comparison to make. Why learn to chart on a paper chart, when we have a chart plotter? Imagine using your GPS to drive to Florida without any streets entered into the data base. That is what your chart plotter is doing. There are no "streets" at sea. Yes, there is a chart on the screen, but it is like looking at a paper chart through a straw. If you are at Saybrook Point Marina and you ask the chart plotter to give you a course to Bell 8, what will happen? You will try to cross over the breakwater. If you did not have a paper chart and didn't know the area, you could be in trouble.

Why become a member? Have you ever gone to the national web site and looked up member benefits? There are a great number available. One is insurance. I only have liability insurance on my boat. I had Boat US insurance for many years. I was paying about \$450 per year. When I asked for a quote from USPS insurance the fee for the same coverage was \$177. Do you have insurance with USPS?

Other reasons to join include: the programs at meetings; other boaters to talk boats with; great rendezvous and cruises. If you are new to boating, the old salts love nothing better than helping you learn. If you are experienced, you can help the new members with your knowledge.

Don't tell me that you cannot get new members in your Squadron. Some Squadrons are growing their membership. They are taking advantage of the six month free membership for our ABC students and the ability to offer our advanced courses to non-members and sign them up. If other squadrons can do it, so can you. You must have a positive attitude, and be welcoming.

Hope to see all of you at our activities this summer. This issue is full of them and I hope you take advantage of your own membership.

All Day -- The pool is open! A Coast Guard Vessel from Homeland Security will be present for information and display. Vessel Examiners will be available throughout the day both Saturday and Sunday to perform Vessel Safety Checks.

Friday and Sunday: There will be informal get-to-gathers for dinner and breakfast on your own.

Advance tickets are available from your Squadron Commander. Adults \$7.00 (\$10.00 at the door), Children under 12 \$4.00. Please bring your own lawn chair(s) as seating is limited for the meal.

Dockage \$3.95/ft, shore power \$11/30a, \$22/50a all per night. Complimentary cable TV and WiFi. Docking arrangements can be made using their website or call 860-395-3080. State that you are a member of District 1 USPS.

Directions:

From I-95 or Rt. 9, take Rt 154 south (becomes main St. in Saybrook, then becomes College St) then right onto Bridge St. See Signs for Saybrook Point Inn and Spa and the Marina.

This is your chance to bring some of your old flares and light or shoot them off. It's a lot of fun for the older kids and very instructional for the adults. If you don't have any, we have extras.

Get your Vessel Safety Checkup

It's the time of the year again for your boat to have its annual safety check. We'll have examiners available at the June Rendezvous. It's free and a lot cheaper than getting a ticket from the Coast Guard or DEEP while on the water. The Vessel Safety Check (VSC) consists of checking your vessel for all the Federal and State safety requirements as well as critical safety issues such as your engine's blower.

If your boat passes, we give you the Coast Guard sticker to display on your boat. I urge you to get a Vessel Safety Check from your Vessel Safety examiner in your squadron or district. If you fly the USPS Ensign on your boat you need to tell the whole boating community that you have a safe boat and the sticker on the side of your boat will do that for you. Every Vessel in District 1 should have a Vessel Safety Check (VSC) sticker on it.

District 1 Sail Race

After a few years of hiatus, we are pleased to bring back the District Sail Race. We are joining with the Branford Yacht Club to take advantage of their 14 July "Branford Invitational" which is part of the ECSA (Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association) racing schedule. If you are already a member of the ECSA, you can take part and earn ECSA points as well as credit for your squadron. Trophies will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each class.

Eligibility: The Branford Invitational has hosted as many as 75 racers in the past in up to 8 classes, both spinnaker and non-spinnaker. You must have a 2012 PHRF-ESCA rating certificate to race, which the yacht club or ECSA can help you obtain.

Starting line and Time: Off Branford Harbor between Negro Heads and Cow and Calf Buoys. First Gun will be at 11:00 am. Spinnaker classes will have windward and leeward courses. Non-spinnaker classes will have a triangular course.

Dockage: If you are not in the Branford area, you can sail over Friday and use their dockage free of charge and make a weekend of it.

Entry fee: \$35.00 per boat (\$30.00 for USSA members) plus \$12 prepaid per person attending the awards party/ \$15 when paid at the party. Non-racers can come and enjoy the day and join in the party.

Wear your PFD

Whether you are sailing, motoring or paddling, please wear your PFD at all times. The "National Safe Boating Council" has released the fatality statistics for 2010 and while the number of fatalities in the country was down to 672 from the ten year average of 705, the statistics show that 485 of the victims were not wearing PFDs and 122 were (the remaining 65 were "unknown" as to PFD wear). A boater can be thrown overboard or have a head trauma and be rendered helpless. Your PFD might be the difference between life and death. Don't even think about it, just **Wear It!**

What is a Poker Run?

A Poker Run is an organized event where the objective is to obtain the best Poker "hand." A Poker Run is not a race. It's a game of chance. The winner with the best "hand" will win the Grand Prize. There will also be prizes for the 2nd and 3rd best hands. Winners will be determined, and prizes will be awarded at the cookout. Participants are encouraged to register before September 20th. Each participating boat navigates to five checkpoints with the help of clues. At each checkpoint a sealed envelope containing a playing card is given after correctly answering a boating question. Time doesn't matter. The best hand does! Remember, only 1 entrant will be allowed per dingy. Your boat will be your dinghy, sunfish, canoe, kayak, or other tender. Don't have a dinghy, no problem. Our dinghy captains will be happy to dinghy you around!
