#### Sailing to 100 – New Haven Centennial Celebration Planning

Ed: the New Haven Squadron will be celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2014 and the District is planning to join with them and host its June Rendezvous in New Haven on the same weekend. Details on the District Rendezvous will be provided in the spring Sounds of 1. The article below was provided by Cdr Donna Ferrucci and Centennial Chair P/C Richard Hackley.

The following contains some historic information handed down to us by P/C John Murphy in his article "Laying the Keel of the New Haven Power Squadron", written for our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 1989.

In the winter of 1913-1914, a circular letter by Roger Upton, describing the activities of the Power Squadron of the Boston Yacht Club, of which he was Commander, was received by many East Coast yacht clubs. He was suggesting that these clubs send delegates to a meeting in New York to consider the matter of organizing other Power Squadrons, all to be grouped under a central organization. It had been decided that from the New Haven area Frank S. Cornwell, Osborne A. Day, and John K. Murphy were to be the Examining Board for this new district, if they should prove qualified.

Sometime after this meeting in New York, Nathaniel L. Stebbins, an officer serving under Roger Upton in Boston, met with the three men at the Union League Club in New Haven. All three men were former Naval Officers or Naval Militia and passed a fairly detailed exam. They, in turn, examined applicants for membership in the Power Squadron of New Haven, as it was then called. Twenty-four men from four area clubs (the New Haven Yacht Club, the Waucoma Yacht Club, the City Point Yacht Club, and the Volunteer Sailing Club), whose names appear on the original charter dated April 25, 1914, established the new unit.

To celebrate that period of time when both the New Haven Power Squadron and the central organization, USPS, were founded, we have booked two events to be held on the weekend of June 20-21, 2014. On Friday evening, 20 June, we will have dinner at the site of the creation of the District Examining Board, the Union League Café, which today is an upscale restaurant featuring French cuisine. There we will enjoy a full course price fixed dinner, including dessert and wine, tax and gratuity for \$80 per person. To entertain our guests, we are putting together a reenactment of the examining board discussion... at least our version of what may have taken place. Everyone is encouraged to come dressed in period attire appropriate for 1914. The second event which anchors our celebration is a four hour dinner cruise aboard the vessel Mystique, of the Lady Katherine Cruise Line, on Saturday, 21 June. We will depart from the Long Wharf dock in New Haven Harbor at 1900 hours to a full course meal with Branford Harbor as our destination to watch the town's Fourth of July fireworks in high class style. The Mystique is a 120' multi-level cruise ship with an air conditioned fine wood and white linen interior and an open upper deck for unparalleled viewing. All the while the fifteen piece 2<sup>nd</sup> Company Governor's Foot Guard Dance Band will be playing their hearts out. The cost for this is \$90 per person.

Anyone wishing to attend both events will get a \$20 discount... that's \$150 per person for both, if paid by February 1, 2014. We do encourage people to book early, as seating is limited at each function. # **Spring Education Initiative**

We are encouraging all squadrons to schedule ahead all course offerings (at a minimum) through the summer of 2014. This would include all public course offerings (ABC) and advanced grade and elective courses as well. Additionally, if your Squadron is contemplating any seminars they should be scheduled as well. The target date for getting your schedules into district is New Year's Day. This will allow sufficient time to compile the course offerings for distribution at the boat shows. If you are contemplating a winter ABC course, keep in mind the Hartford Boat show is the last week of January. A more ambitious goal would be for squadrons to schedule courses two and even three years out.
