From New York. Bridgeport - Interstate 95 North Exit 44, Kimberly Avenue, (exit ramp splits). Bear to the right at the end of the exit ramp. At the first stop light, turn right onto the Boulevard. Follow around to stop light at Howard Avenue. Take a right onto Howard Avenue. Follow Howard Avenue to the end, turn right and immediate left into driveway of PYC and Sage American Grill.

From New Haven, New London - Interstate 95 South Exit 45, the Boulevard, bear left (exit ramp splits) off the exit ramp coming to a stop sign. Take a left onto the Boulevard. Follow to the next stop sign (.3 of a mile) and turn Right onto Howard Avenue.
