#### Spring Conference Program Kathleen Burns, Executive Director of the CMTA On the Horizon: Navigating Boating Recreation through Emerging Challenges.

Many of these issues have been overcome for the betterment of the recreation community while also improving the environment and the quality of the waters we enjoy.

Among the current challenges for the boating public are: Water Quality – the Big Picture; Aquatic Invasive Species, local and national; Legislation, Education and Solutions; Fiberglass recycling – is there a future?; Wake sports. The boom and what the future looks like.

**P/C/C Robert L Woods, SN** passed away on 10 November 2019. Bob played an enormous part in the history of several of our squadrons, District 1, and our National Organization.

Bob was born in Bristol, CT. and was brought up in Plainville. After high school he enlisted in the U.S. Army's ROTC program, attaining the rank of second lieutenant. He fought in the Korean War as a forward observer for artillery and air support and was awarded the Silver Star for heroism, and also the Bronze Star with "V" for Valor in combat. Bob met the love of his life one summer at Grove Beach Point in Westbrook, CT. The romance that started as teenagers lasted over seventy years! Bob married Polly while he was on leave from active duty in the army. After his discharge they settled in Plainville where they raised their four children together. Boating has been a big part of Bob's life ever since he was a young man.



He got involved in the United States Power Squadron, rising to Commander of the New Britain Power Squadron in 1964 and later served in the Saybrook Power Squadron. He became Secretary of District 1 for 1965-67, Executive Officer for 1968-69 and Commander for 1969-71. During this time he participated in the annual meetings of our National Organization and became the National Admin Officer for 1972-74, Executive Officer for 1974-76, and the youngest Chief Commander for 1976-78. Following these leadership roles, Bob continued to support his Squadron, District and National with elected and appointed Committee Chair positions until last year.

Today she is immersed in legislative activity, development of a maritime workforce and producing the Hartford Boat Show at Mohegan Sun. She is a graduate of the Newhouse School of Public Communications at Syracuse University and splits her time between Connecticut and Cape Cod.
