District 1 2020-21 Election of Officers

Our District Bylaws allow for an election of officers via 'electronic means' and our District Secretary sent out an election ballot to the 'District Conference'. The 'District Conference' is composed of the District Bridge, the immediate past District Commander and the past District Commanders who are active members of district squadrons and living in the district, the Elected Committee Chairs, the 13 Squadron Commanders, and two Squadron 'Delegates' named by each Squadron's Commander. These are the members that would have voted at the District Conference. The ballot consisted of the slate of officers nominated by the Nominating Committee as published in the Spring *Sounds of 1*.

District 1 Change of Watch

The election was completed and the slate of officers for 2020-21 were duly elected. The new Bridge is identical to the 2019-20 Bridge as shown on page 1. Our bylaws allow the Bridge to continue to function until a Change of Watch takes place. This may take place at the Fall Conference in November if not sooner.



2018 U.S. Coast Guard Boating Statistics

- The fatality rate was 5.3 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels, which tied as the third lowest rate in the program's history. This rate represents a 3.6 percent decrease from last year's fatality rate of 5.5 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels.
- Property damage totaled about \$46 million.
- Alcohol continued to be the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents in 2018, accounting for 100 deaths, or 19 percent of total fatalities.
- Operator inattention, improper lookout, operator inexperience, machinery failure, and excessive speed ranked as the top five primary contributing factors in accidents.
- Where the cause of death was known, 77 percent of fatal boating accident victims drowned. Of those drowning victims with reported life jacket usage, 84 percent were not wearing a life jacket.
- Where boating instruction was known, 74 percent of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had not received boating safety instruction.
- The most common vessel types involved in reported accidents were open motorboats, personal watercraft, and cabin motorboats. Where vessel type was known, the vessel types with the highest percentage of deaths were open motorboats (50 percent), kayaks (13.5 percent), and canoes (7 percent).
