2022 Spring Conference

The 2022 Spring Conference was held on 19 March at Campagna's Restaurant in Portland, CT. 27 members attending from 9 squadrons.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag led by D/Lt Ken Bell, Sr., AP, followed by the Invocation by D/Lt Paul Bialecki, P, Chaplain. Paul then led us in a Remembrance Ceremony for 12 of our valued members who passed in the last year. The full list is on page 7.

The message from the Chief Commander Craig D. Fraser, SN-IN, was presented via power point by Stf/C Michael D. Friedman, N from District 4. District Secretary, Linda Lewis, summarized it as follows: Your National Bridge is there to assist squadrons and programs. National is making some changes in multiple ways. Membership is Job #1. They are improving knowledge and enthusiasm thru marketing, education, and reorganization. With regards to marketing they have implemented new brochures, guide books, ads, and a "How to do it" Guide.

In education there are online and virtual classrooms, seminars, and webinars. NASBLA has both classroom and virtual ABC course only in English thru 12-31-2022. There are monthly briefings in the educational department. One big change is that National now allows us to purchase a single instructor seminar kit and give the seminar to a meeting (See Page 6). If the members want 'credit' for the seminar in their record, there would be a charge.

With regard to reorganization they are looking at simplification and reorganizion of squadrons to be known as "Clubs" i.e. America's Boating Club, with more informality and flexibility. Districts would have an option to continue or disband and form local informal consortia of Squadrons. With this proposed reorganization there would be more direct support of clubs from National with reduced red tape. The details of this reorganization proposal are available on the National website. National will be looking for additional input this spring and then finalizing the plans this summer for full implementation in the summer of 2023.

The meeting continued with our normal 'Breakout' sessions presented to the entire group. Cdr Art Andrea, AP then presented the awards for 2021 (see page 7). Following lunch, the reports of the Bridge Officers and Committees were given including the Budget for next year and the report of the Audit Committee. Both were approved by the Conference.

The report of the Nominating Committee was then read by Nominating Committee member, P/D/Lt/C Clifford W. McKibbin, SN after which Stf/C Friedman held the election and swore in the new Bridge and Committee Members.



Dockage: The dockage is \$5.25/ft/day. 30a service is \$15/night and two 30a or one 50a is \$30. Full refund if canceled before noon 3 days before.

To make a reservation, call 860-767-2483 or go online to "Dockwa.com" and enter the location "Safe Harbor-Essex Island" to find the marina. Enter the dates you want to reserve and follow the steps. When you get to the box labeled "special request", enter "Traveling with the Power Squadron" so they can put our members together to the extent possible. If you have special needs please specify those as well. Note that 'Docwa' is best used on a laptop, not a cell phone.

Directions to drive: Take Rt. 9 to exit 3. Turn left onto Rt. 154. From North, turn left onto West Ave. From South, turn right onto West Ave. Take West Ave into the center of town and continue down Main St. Take a left onto Ferry St and another left onto Pratt St. Park in any available spot on the street. Take the small ferry over to Essex Island (no charge).

Dock Fees — \$3.00 / ft. LOA/night weekdays, \$3.50 weekends. Electric is \$10/day for 30amp, \$15/day for 50a or twin 30a.Slip fee includes ice and water, a laundromat, handicap accessible shower and restroom facilities, barbecue/picnic area, free wifi and pump out, 20% restaurant discount, and concierge service. Car rental, Shoreline East Railroad, bicycle rental, and tennis courts are nearby. There is a concert by the Rum-Runners on Fridays at 5 p.m. across the street. We monitor VHF Channel 9. Contact: 203-874-1610 by 15 June.

Milford Harbor Facts – the harbor is dredged to 12'. The Charles Island bell is R "16". Caution: if approaching from the west, do not cross the shallow sandbar between the island and the beach, pass Charles Island bell to seaward. Follow channel markers into harbor, R2, R4, R6, R6a. Watch out for the rock in the harbor opposite Milford Yacht Club.

Get your Squadron more involved with Civic Activity.

Two Power Squadron activities that do a lot of good for the boating community are:

Vessel Safety Checks. You can become a Vessel Safety Examiner and be your Marina's 'go-to' person for inspections. Your fellow boaters will appreciate having the USCG sticker attesting to the fact that they have been inspected and met the basic requirements for boating safety. It may even save them a USCG inspection.

You will take a short course, pass a test, and do 5 checks a year to maintain your qualifications. Contact D/Lt/C Pat Pabouet, District VSC Chair, at argus06108@aol.com to find out more.

CoOp Charting. Again, you can help the boating community as well as the USCG to make sure Nautical Aids to Navigation (ATONs) are properly located. We also report problems such as missing numbers, poor paint job, obscured by foliage, etc.

Going on a CoOp outing is a fun group event with a few hours checking ATONs and perhaps a lunch at a landing. Reports of problems are then made to the USCG and all inspections are reported to the USPS CoOp Committee for credit. All the reporting is on-line and fairly straight-forward.

Our District was 9th in the country due to Hartford's efforts. If a few more Squadrons got involved, we could do even better.

- Hartford has 'adopted' the CT River but that doesn't stop other Squadrons from checking it as well.
- No Squadron has adopted other major waterways in CT. There are a lot of them. These include: New Haven/Branford area, the Milford area, the Housatonic River, Niantic Bay, the Thames River, Mystic/Stonington/Watch Hill/Fisher's Island.

2020 U.S. Coast Guard Boating Statistics

- The fatality rate was 6.5 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels based on 5,265 accidents involving 767 deaths. This rate represents a 25% increase from the 2019 fatality rate. This was perhaps due to the increase in boat purchases and lack of training during the pandemic.
- WEAR IT!

- Property damage totaled more than 62.5 million.
- Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents; where the primary cause was known, it was listed as the leading factor in 18% of deaths.
- Where cause of death was known, 75% of fatal boating accident victims drowned. Of those drowning victims with reported life jacket usage, 86% were not wearing a life jacket.
- Where length was known, eight out of every ten boaters who drowned were using vessels less than 21 feet in length.
- Where instruction was known, 77% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction.
- There were 247 accidents in which at least one person was struck by a propeller. Collectively, these accidents resulted in 39 deaths and 241 injuries.
- Operator inattention, improper lookout, operator inexperience, excessive speed, and alcohol use rank as the top five primary contributing factors in accidents.
- The most common vessel types involved in reported accidents were open motorboats (46%), personal watercraft (22%), and cabin motorboats (13%). Where data was known, the vessel types with the highest percentage of deaths were open motorboats (50%), kayaks (15%), and personal watercraft (9%).
