The mahogany bar, with two marble and chrome soda fountains dates back to the early 1900s. There is a Tiffany-style lamp on the bar and the Welte Orchestrion. Zaharakos is a one-of-a-kind destination that is filled with the sights and sounds of a turn-of-the-century confectionary and soda "shoppe". All the ice cream is made on the premises. A favorate -- the Green River Float -- is a bright green soda with a lemon lime flavor. During the Super Bowl the Zaharakos Gom Sandwich was selected as one of the Super 46 Sandwiches -- a must for Super Bowl visitors. Don't miss this 'must do' activity.
