

band and dancing overlooking the river festivities.

Saturday evening was the 100th Anniversary Banquet, black tie and elegant dress, followed by dancing.

We also attended informative sessions and the special keynote speaker, author Robert N. Macomber. He has written eleven novels, in the Honor Series, of naval historic fiction following the life and career of Lt. Cmdr. Peter Wake. There are more to come.

Two resolutions were passed, one to avoiding scheduling meetings in conflict with major religious holidays and one to separate marketing and public relation committees.
