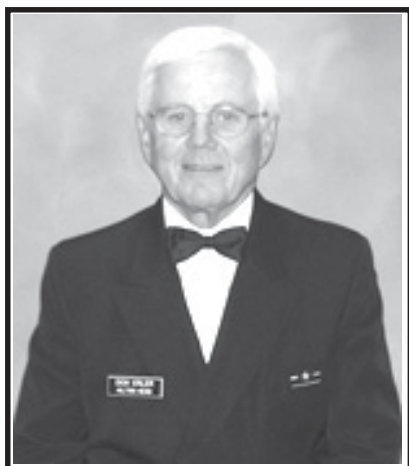

National Safe Boating Week (NSBW) was 20-26 May 2006 and many squadrons took advantage of the opportunity to promote boating safety and enable boaters in your area to "Skipper with Confidence". It is not too soon to plan for 2007. NSBW info is available at usps.org/localusps/d26 Public Relations and Usps.org/XO. Don't just target marinas and boating related areas. The grocery stores and other areas frequented by the Admiral are areas of opportunity. The Captain may think he knows it all but if you show the Admiral that there is an advantage to taking a course, the Captain and maybe the crew will attend your courses.

The Cooperative Advertising Program was established to help support the public relations activities of districts and squadrons as they advertise and promote the Boating courses and the image of local squadrons and USPS. Our new D/26 Public Relations Officer (PRO) Mike Zafot, will need your reports by 5 Oct 06 as the D/26 report is due to National 1 Nov 06. Eligible expenses are reimbursed at the rate of 50 percent of expenditures up to the district's allocation. So, if you want this free money get your reports in. You can find Mike Zafot and other District and Squadron officers at the D/26 website under the online directory.

Our Vessel Safety Check (VSC) program is a year round benefit and examiners may be found online. A VSC is also a great time to encourage the non-member boat owner to take the Public Boating Course and other public courses.

Your Nominating Committee has a lasting and profound effect on your squadron. The planning (or lack of) will affect your squadron for many years to come. Officers should know the duties of their office (use the Operations Manual) including attendance at district meetings, and they must be willing to give the required time and effort for the position. Commanders, Executive Officers and Past Commanders should confirm that the committee is functioning and has a five year plan. With proper planning the nominating committee's daunting task can be realized.

Then, there was the GALA, 50th Anniversary of the Savannah River Sail and Power Squadron, held in Aiken 16 May. In addition to the wonderful dinner and camaraderie among guests from D/26 and host members, the changing of the Flag ceremony by the Bridge Officers of the SRS&PS was most impressive.

The Summer Council Meeting was conducted by D/26 XO Archie Trawick, SN in the absence of D/C Dick Erler, AP on Saturday Morning 3 June 2006, in the Conference Room at the Savannah Village Resort. A number of things were brought up concerning changes in USPS, i.e, waive the educational membership requirements for a period of three years; reduce the current dues categories to single membership at one rate and family group membership at one and a half times the single rate; and, establish a new member initiation fee of \$25 for either a primary active and all associated members. These were discussed at length and a consensus of opinion by the voting group was given to the representatives to National to vote at the Governing Board in New York in August.

With only two national meetings a year, there doesn't seem much new earth shattering news educationally. I'm assuming the new seminars will be available some time this summer or early fall.

Our 13 squadrons responded admirably for National Safe Boating Week. Many held public boating courses, Chart Smart courses, Vessel Safety Checks, radio and TV appearances and other safety demonstrations. One even had a proclamation signed by the mayor of the town.

By the time you receive this, the vote regarding open membership with no "boating course requirement" should be history. At summer council, there was a lively discussion regarding the topic. A straw poll revealed that District 26 was not in favor of allowing membership with no boating education requirement. Why would someone take a course after they joined or would we not allow them to renew once they had joined. These are no brainers.

As my tenure ends, my eight years working in the Educational Department have been a rewarding experience, especially the last three as District Educational Officer. All of the squadron educational officers have been most helpful in responding to the needs of their own squadron as well as to the district and national levels. As DEO for District 26 we have had one national Charles F. Chapman award winner in 2004 with P/C Steven Phillips, SN of Savannah River.

I want to thank all of the Squadron Educational Officers, especially those who have served consecutively with me during my term. Each one has certainly made my job much easier and more pleasant. Our contact was primarily through email, but frequently there were telephone calls to answer specific squadron questions and concerns.

During my three years as DEO, there have been many changes with the new Piloting and Advanced Piloting courses and the new Boat Smart exam. Many of the educational departments were combined at the national level making for a more compact unit

I encourage all Squadrons to provide this training and to report it. D/26 was second in conducting OT classes last year and with a little effort we can improve that record this year.

A second emphasis area was Membership. D/Lt Tom Courneya, P, D/26 Membership/Member Involvement Chair recently reported that of the 35 districts in USPS, we are one of just two that achieved the National Membership Committee Goal of a net one percent growth for the year. Tom stated "Everyone in each of our Squadrons who worked very hard to deliver this impressive membership growth for D/26 is to be congratulated. They have proven that membership growth for USPS is possible."

A special "Atta Boy" goes to the Thurmond Lake Squadron for hosting a very successful Cruise and Rendezvous in June. They had 92 members attending the Friday night dinner, 28 boats for the Cruise and 149 attending the Saturday Picnic. A special thanks to Paula Courneya and JB Gividen who were the primary organizers of the event and to all who attended or helped out. Those D/26 Squadron members who have not participated in District events have missed out on a lot of fun and camaraderie.

District 26 Flag Fly It Proudly!

By now, I hope that all have heard that District 26 has adopted a flag, that it has been approved by National, and D/Lt/C Ron Osburn, AP has them available for purchase.

The heraldry of the flag is as follows: The red, white and blue of the flag are in keeping with the colors of our National organization's Ensign. The blue background represents the many bodies of water on which we cruise. The red, white, and blue triangles, formed by the chevrons, represent the three sides of the USPS triangle. (Civic service, self-education, and fraternal boating). The two stars represent the states of South Carolina and Georgia in which our squadrons are located.

This is quoted from Section 9.15 of the Operations Manual concerning the display of a district flag: 'A district flag is an "association flag" not a club burgee, and is not to be worn (flown) without a squadron burgee from that district. As an association flag, it is worn on a spreader halyard and is inferior to the burgee, whether on a spreader halyard or multiple hoisted.'

Let's all proudly fly our district's flag as we sail the many waters of District 26.

This issue will include: Information on the upcoming D/26 Fall Conference and COW, and the Nominating Committee report..

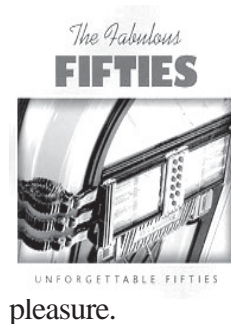

Registration for the Fall Conference will begin in the Marriott at 1500 until 1800. The SRS&PS Hospitality room will open at 1500 to welcome our guests to the CSRA (Central Savannah River Area).



Beginning at 1830, a cash bar will be available and dinner will be served at 1900. After dinner, we will be entertained by some Fabulous Fifties fun! Dress is casual so feel free to dress as if it were 50 years ago! During the evening, a Silent Auction will be available for your viewing and bidding pleasure.

Registration will continue on Saturday morning, 21 October, from 0800 – 0930 for those of you that cannot make it to Augusta on Friday. Breakfast will be on your own.
