What do I need to know to participate?

Wear older clothes (Light color pants or Jeans, long socks and sneakers or heavy shoes). Light colors can be helpful in easily detecting ticks. This is especially true if we are working in weeds, leaves or brush. Please bring gloves if you can but I will have Medium and Large Nitrile gloves available.

There will be a Beach Captain who is a member of COA there to provide instructions. Hazardous materials are very rarely encountered, but be on the lookout and report problems.

This is a state wide event and other groups will be participating. The event is "rain or shine" but if it is too inclement, I would advise you to use your best judgment.

Everyone welcome, Bring the kids! Even if you cannot help pick up debris, a few people are still needed to help organize the event. For instance, you can be a greeter or help with refreshments.
