Seaplane operation on Presque Isle Bay (submitted by Tom Pallotta)

Good afternoon,

I want to share for your awareness that the seaplane operation idea discussed a couple of years ago has been approved. I've included below general information about the operation from the main point of contact:

"Seaplane operations have been approved on Presque Isle Bay and Lake Erie by the FAA, US Coast Guard, US Army Corp of Engineers and the PA Bureau of Aviation. Operations are slated to commence with ice-out in April 2023. Unmarked parallel landing lanes, 6/24 - 3,000' x 200' are designated outside of the marine turning basin and marine channel. Recreational boaters and commercial marine operations as stand-on vessels should maintain course and speed and treat a seaplane on the water as another vessel."

Meetings to discuss Marine Sanctuary (for information - dates passed)

<u>The invitation</u> affects everyone who lives in Fairview Township/Erie County. About 740 square miles (or 75 miles of the shoreline of Lake Erie) has been proposed as a possible National Marine Sanctuary. The National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration will be the governing agency.

The agency is inviting the public to make comments on:

- Boundary alternatives for the proposed sanctuary.
- The location, nature, and value of the cultural and historical resources in the area under consideration.
- Specific threats to these resources.
- Information on the Indigenous heritage of the area.
- The potential socioeconomic, cultural, and biological impacts resulting from designation as a national marine sanctuary.
- The non-regulatory actions NOAA should prioritize within its draft management plan for the proposed sanctuary.
- The regulatory framework most appropriate for management of the proposed sanctuary.
- The benefits to the economy of the region, including promoting sustainable tourism and recreation.
- A permanent name for the proposed sanctuary.

There is a great deal of history in our lake to protect. If it becomes a Sanctuary, regulations will likely exist, but are not established as yet. Ideas?

Two meetings are coming up where if registered, individuals can speak their thoughts and concerns. On June 27 from 2 to 3:30 will be a "virtual" meeting… The live meeting is June 28 from 6:30 to 8 pm at Blasco Library in Erie. The Docket # is NOAA-NOS-2023-0039.

America's Boating Channel Reminder:

Knowledge of the Navigation Rules Helps Prevent Boating Accidents

As we prepare to celebrate July Fourth, don't forget that knowledge of the rules of navigation helps prevent boating accidents. If you need a refresher before getting out on the water, you can access an invaluable library of videos produced by America's Boating Channel. These videos are available to USPS members to view and download for free at <u>bit.ly/USPSABC</u>. There is an index to help you find exactly what you need, which is very convenient for instructors who want to use these videos in the classroom without the need for an internet connection.

For example, Season Four's <u>"Behavioral Consequences"</u> (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yWq-jshx8yU&t=44s</u>) video covers the importance to recreational boat operators of having a working knowledge of the navigation rules. Viewers learn about the dangers of not following the rules of the road. Also featured are tips for responsible boating. Boating responsibly can lead to lasting memories, while



bad boating behaviors can cause issues ranging from mere embarrassment to major catastrophe.


America's Boating Channel[™] produced a sequel to this video in Season Five titled <u>"Collision Avoidance"</u>

(https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7cXv6s7wqjE&t=1s), which covers the most basic and essential navigation rules. Viewers learn how to determine stand-on and give-way vessels in various

circumstances. It also features tips for steering clear of potentially dangerous situations. For example, at night not using navigation lights or not learning how to interpret them can lead to incidents with more serious outcomes than during the day. Again, these two videos are good refreshers before visiting your local waterway at a time of year when it will be most crowded.

Viewers learn the benefits of wearing them while boating. Also featured are tips to consider when buying a new life jacket.
- <u>SLIPS, TRIPS, AND FALLS</u> (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CP-3FXRcz9M&t=4s</u>) premiered June 10 and examines basic causes of many boating injuries. Viewers learn the dangers of these types of accidents. Also featured are tips to mitigate them.
- <u>PARTNER IN COMMAND</u> (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FPKnrHTh4c4</u>) premiered June 20 and covers skills passengers need to master to take the helm if their boat operator becomes incapacitated. 
