America's Boating Channel™ Warns of Electric Shock Drowning

Electric Shock Drowning (ESD) is a little-known and often-unidentified killer, severely injuring and killing people every year. It occurs when faulty wiring sends electric current into water, which passes through the body and causes muscle paralysis that can result in drowning.



Faulty wiring or the use of damaged electrical cords and other devices on docks and boats can cause the surrounding water to become "energized," with no visible warning. Avoid getting in the water within 150 feet of where AC power is in use and learn how to test if dangerous electrical currents are in the water around your boat.

To help boaters understand the danger of Electric Shock Drowning (ESD), Season Four of America's Boating Channel offers the video "Electric Shock Drowning (ESD)." The video shows how ESD causes deaths and injuries at marinas nationwide, including many undetected incidents. Viewers also will learn about ESD prevention and how to install ground

protection on docks and boats. Also featured are differences between ESD dangers in saltwater and freshwater.

You can share closed-captioned streaming versions online and show download versions at in-person gatherings. While none of these are nearby, they may still be interesting.

An Educated Boater is a Safer Boater! Marine Navigation Class

The New Orleans Power Squadron / America's Boating Club will present the Marine Navigation Class during Spring / Summer, 2024 at 7601 Breakwater Drive, New Orleans, LA 70124

Marine Navigation is the first course in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation, covering the basics of coastal and inland navigation. This course focuses on navigation as it is done on recreational boats today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of traditional techniques so the student will be able to find his/her way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. View the Table of Contents for this course.

Ten classes of two hours each normally are scheduled for presentation of this course. In addition, the students have seven days to complete the open book exam. Topics covered include:

- · Charts and their interpretation
- · Landmarks and navigation aids (buoys, day marks, lights, etc.)
- · Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic
- · Use of GPS basic GPS displays and information they provide, setting up waypoints and routes, staying on a GPS course
 - · Pre-planning safe courses and entering them into the GPS
- · Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techniques such as bearings and dead reckoning
 - The "Seaman's Eve" simple skills for checking that one is on course


Registration for this course is open. Course begins 7 May 2024. First class starts at 6:00 PM and happens once a week for 10 weeks plus exam. Average 2 hours per session.

Course w/ Student Manual – \$100 for USPS Members, \$150 for non-Members.

Students need access to a computer or Laptop on which they will install Open CPN software as part of the course. They will also need basic plotting tools: dividers or compass, 4-by-15 inch USPS Plotting tool and pencils/ erasers. If you do not have dividers and plotting tools they can be purchased in class or ordered directly from USPS.

Cheeseburgers in Paradise May 25 - Open noon, Burgers 1:30pm



Moonraker Lake near Docks (from google, not GPS): Lat 30° 13' 20.91" Long 89° 48' 38.91"



Attention Vessel Examiners: New Mandatory Workshop

There is a new 2024 Vessel Safety Check Workshop that was created by the U.S. Coast Guard. All vessel examiners are REQUIRED to complete it no later than June 30, 2024. If not completed by that date, vessel examiners will be de-certified until they complete the workshop. Links to obtain the content are located at the top of the Vessel Safety Check Updates webpage. The content is available in PDF and PowerPoint formats. NOTE: The PDF will open in your browser, but the PowerPoint version will be downloaded to your computer. Vessel examiners also need to complete Appendix A, which is included. The time needed to complete the workshop should be less than 30 minutes. Once you have finished, click to record that you have done it. –Jeff McKinney
