2024 National Meeting Report

As Squadron Commander, I attended the 2024 National Meeting to represent America's Boating Club Peace River. I was accompanied by Lt. Susan Maxwell and Secretary Kris Ayres and Executive Officer Jim Ayres. The conference was held at the Orlando Rosen Center on February 4-11. We only attended the last four days as the beginning was setup and National Committee business. Ralph Bernard, AP of Absecon Island, District 5, was inducted as the new Chief Commander with Mile Wiedel, JN as Executive Officer, Chuck Wells, as Educational Officer, David Allen, Jr., SN as Administrative officer, Al Lankin as Secretary and Shirley Heald as Treasurer.

In his outgoing information, Past Chief Commander Craig Fraser, SN, highlighted our issues with membership and funding. The two go hand in hand with fewer members bringing in less revenue. The total membership of America's Boating Club is just under 18,000 with a 2023 loss in membership of 8.9%. This is up from the 10 year average loss in members of 6.2%. It was also recognized that the existing membership is aging and the competition for new members is fierce when you take into consideration the other avenues for education available on the internet.

Revenue is down but the endowment funds are doing well in the booming stock market, and through November 2023 have gained an average in excess of 12%. A plea was made for donations to the education fund between now and the end of March as a benefactor has offered to match all contributions up to \$100,000.00. It was reported that the 2023 Fall Governing Board Meeting lost \$60,000.00 due to low attendance and not meeting our room and lodging quotas. The Meeting Committee is researching ways to lower expenses and make the meetings more attractive. The next Governing Board Meeting will be September 24-29 in Pittsburgh, PA.

On a positive note, America's Boating Club TV is thriving and winning awards across the United States and Canada. If you have not seen the programing, please check your local streaming services (Roku, Hulu, etc.) and review the service. We were informed that the State of New York has adopted our TV presentations as the official education tool for their State Safe Boating Certifications.

The Co-op Charting Programs are proving to be a success in many squadrons in organizing day events by car for the members. The Geodesic Marker location program provides a day of activities on land. Also, Marina Inspections can be done without a boat and earn Co-op Charting points for the Squadron and Members.

Vessel Safety Checks were also mentioned as a wonderful way to obtain your Merit Mark. A Merit Mark is awarded for completing ten VSCs.

The National Organization recognizes the problems and is working on solutions. Money will be available to the Squadrons for Public Relation programs to reach out to potential new members.

It was once again reiterated, that if every member would recruit just one new member, out totals would double in 2024. So please look around, talk up the organization and get involved again with the local Squadrons. Let's all look for our one new member. Peace River lost 25% of its members in 2023, or 2.8 times the national average. We need new blood!

Sue and I want to thank the Squadron for allowing us to represent you and our thanks to Kris and Jim Ayres for accompanying us. The meetings are dwindling in number, partly because they are now live streamed, but the face to face contacts are invaluable for future growth and interaction with both National, Districts and local Squadrons.




