WELCOME

Welcome to the largest private boating fraternity in the United States. As a member of the United States Power Squadrons (USPS), you have opened the door to a world of opportunity to acquire an outstanding education in a broad range of topics as they relate to safe recreational boating. In addition, you have the opportunity to regularly meet with others who share your interests at the various functions and activities sponsored by the Sandusky Power Squadron (SPS).

Becoming a new Power Squadron member is exciting, fun, and confusing. This handbook is our effort to help you quickly feel comfortable with and knowledgeable about the basic procedures, protocol, and opportunities that are ahead.

This handbook is intended as a brief overview. For a more detailed understanding of the Squadron, we offer a program called Operations Training (OT) each year. It is free of charge and is recommended for all members.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE USPS

In the early twentieth century, power boating made its entrance upon the scene. Until this time, recreational boating was mostly sail powered. Because everything concerning recreational boating at the time was geared to sailing, there was an immediate gap to be filled.

In 1912, Roger Upton, Rear Commodore of the Boston Yacht Club filled that gap by forming the Power Boat Division of the B.Y.C. One year later it became the "Power Squadron." Roger Upton's idea received considerable media attention, and immediate interest in the Power Squadron idea took off. This interest culminated in 1913 with a conference of 70 clubs and associations of powerboat owners at the New York Yacht Club, to consider the formation of power squadrons. A second conference was held at N.Y. Y. C. on Monday, 2 February 1914, and the USPS was officially formed. USPS was incorporated on 19 February 1915, at which time there were 470 members in 15 squadrons.

Since that time USPS has expanded from coast to coast, in virtually all states, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and more distant areas. Along the way educational courses were developed and improved upon. The Boating Course has been presented for over half a century, and more than 3 million people have taken it to date. Today the USPS comprises over 50,000 members in over 450 squadrons. From the club-within-a-club beginnings of the early 1900's, USPS has become a private, self-supporting, nonprofit fraternal boating organization of both sailors and power boaters, with an incomparable record of achievement.

ABOUT THE SANDUSKY POWER SQUADRON

The Sandusky Power Squadron (SPS) is a unit of the United States Power Squadrons, and was chartered in 1937. We are the second oldest Squadron west of the Allegheny Mountains. From modest beginnings of 24 charter members, we have grown to an average membership of 250. Our membership includes a diverse group of sailors and power boaters, including trailer boaters, and cruising boaters. We are all dedicated to education, civic service, and camaraderie. All members are volunteers, and no one receives any payment. Our Squadron owns a headquarters building in downtown Sandusky. It is used primarily for housing our records and equipment, and as a meeting facility for conducting the educational classes of the Squadron.

THE BRIDGE

The day-to-day operation of the Squadron is conducted by a group of members known as the Bridge. This group consists of the Commander and five officers - the Executive Officer, the Educational Officer, the Administrative Officer, the Secretary, and the Treasurer. Each officer is elected to fulfill the duties of that position for one year. Their respective duties are briefly summarized below:

COMMANDER - Has ultimate responsibility for the success of the administration of the Squadron. He presides at all meetings of the membership and of its Executive Committee, and is fully acquainted with all activities of the Squadron.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER - Second in command and fills in for the Commander whenever necessary. He is also responsible for all of the external functions of the Squadron, which primarily include our civic service activities. Events such as the boat show display booths and National Safe Boating Week are some of the responsibilities.

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER - plans and oversees all educational classes offered to members and to the general public.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER - is responsible for all internal activities of the Squadron, including monthly membership meetings, membership acquisition and retention, and rendezvous.

SECRETARY - records the official minutes of the business meetings, oversees publication of the newsletter and roster, and maintains membership records.

TREASURER - maintains records of and conducts all financial transactions of the Squadron.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This group includes the Bridge officers, the immediate Past Commander, and seven active members from the general membership. The Committee meets monthly, ten times a year, to discuss and decide the policies and directives under which the Squadron will function. All Executive Committee members are elected by the membership, and fulfill one-year terms.

MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

The SPS holds monthly membership meetings with the exception of July and August. The date is the second Monday of the month. After a business meeting, there is usually a program lasting about 30 minutes. Several meetings each year are traditionally exceptions to the rule. These are the Holiday party, the Change of Watch, and the Cookout/Auction.

Details of appropriate attire for each meeting are published in the LOOKOUT, our newsletter. Uniforms are never required, but one is always designated for that particular meeting. Normally casual attire is worn by most members. Attendance at a membership meeting is open to all members. Any member may bring a guest.

SPECIAL OCCASION MEETINGS & EVENTS

The Change of Watch is usually held in early February. This is the time for the installation of the new officers and committee members, and is always attended by the District Commander or his representative. It is a more formal occasion with lots of traditional highlights such as the remembrance of members who have passed away during the previous year, and the swearing-in of the new Bridge. A lighter moment is enjoyed during the "roasting" of the out-going Commander, who is reminded by his predecessors of events and actions he would rather forget!

The Commander's Ball is usually held in April and in addition to our own members are guests from other Squadrons in our District. It is usually a semi-formal affair featuring a social hour, dinner and dancing. This is our opportunity to honor our Commander and spouse for the tremendous time and effort they give to the Squadron. The Cookout/Auction is usually held in June. This is an opportunity to have some fun outdoors and help raise money for the Squadron. It has been held at various locations. Business is normally dispensed with so members can enjoy themselves in a relaxed setting, bidding on many different items acquired through the efforts of our members.

UNIFORMS

Any member in good standing may wear the designated uniform of the United States Power Squadrons. In practice, most members do not choose to purchase a uniform. It is never required to be worn. Those persons wearing a uniform at various Squadron functions are usually present or past officers. If you choose to purchase a uniform, it must reflect your present rank and grade.

There are a variety of uniforms authorized by the USPS, and they are designated by the letters A through G. Styles are similar for men and for women. The uniforms are modeled after official Navy uniforms with unique variations. They may be purchased through private uniform companies such as those advertising in the *ENSIGN*.

It should be mentioned that a navy blue blazer worn by USPS members is often used within or without squadron functions as desirable way to identify with the organization.

COMMUNICATION

In a Squadron of this size, it is always a challenge to keep everyone informed of the activities of the Squadron. Our primary vehicle for this purpose is our monthly newsletter; the *LOOKOUT*. Each household receives one issue monthly (except July and August). It is filled with information to keep you updated and to help you plan for future activities and events. Please note that this publication is mailed via third class mail, and cannot be forwarded. So if your address changes, please notify the editor or the distribution chairman. Their addresses are on the inside front cover.

Our website, www.usps.org/localusps/sandusky, keeps a current calendar of activities updated, as well as other valuable information.

The monthly membership meetings are also a valuable resource for communications. You have the opportunity to talk with other members, and timely announcements are usually made during the business meeting.

Remember that communication has to work two ways. In addition to the Squadron keeping you informed, we need to hear from you. Any Bridge officer is available to help answer your questions or concerns. Also, if you are not receiving mailings or have moved, please notify the Secretary.

DUES

Membership dues are payable on an annual basis to the Squadron Treasurer. New members are assessed a pro-rated amount based on the amount of time remaining in the dues year. The billed amount includes sums for local (Squadron), District, and National. Make checks payable to the Sandusky Power Squadron and mail to the Treasurer.

ROSTER

The Squadron maintains a record of pertinent information about each member in a roster. It is updated continually on computerized records. We publish a roster of current membership about every other year. It is distributed free of charge to members. New members are usually given a copy of the roster after joining.

The roster contains a wealth of information. It is valuable in providing specific data about other members, such as date of joining, number of merit marks, and spouse's name. It also includes basic information such as name, address, and telephone numbers.

The roster is only as good as the data it presents. It is the responsibility of each member to keep us informed of changes in their listings. Tell us if changed telephone numbers, address, etc.. Call or send this information to the Secretary who will pass it along to the roster chairman.

USPS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The USPS Educational program is diverse and challenging. It offers members the promise of greater safety and enjoyment on the water, the satisfaction of personal accomplishment, and the opportunity to share with others the knowledge and skill one has acquired.

There are three divisions in the USPS educational program:

Advanced Grades - These are the core of the curriculum and are taken in sequence.

Elective Courses - An assortment of marine related courses that can be taken in any order.

Supplemental Program - A collection of short, home-study courses on special topics.

ADVANCED GRADES

Seamanship - S

This introductory course provides basic information on all aspects of boating. Topics covered include the various types of boats and their construction as well as their handling characteristics, boat handling under adverse conditions, rules of the road, & aids to navigation.

Piloting - P

Greater depth is given to some of the topics covered in Seamanship. There is practical instruction in position determination based on plotting courses and dead reckoning. Also covered is detailed information on government regulations, marine radios, what charts are available and what they show, as well as compass installation and adjustment.

Advanced Piloting - AP

This course covers all the basic concepts needed for safe navigation in coastal waters as well as on lakes and rivers. This course is a must for all who intend to cruise extensively. Topics included expand on the basic piloting and charting skills, the use of various types of bearings, and the prediction of tides and currents. Prerequisites: Seamanship and Piloting.

Junior Navigation - JN

Junior Navigation is the first in a two-part program of study in offshore navigation. It is designed as a practical "how to" course. Students will learn the practical use of sextants, the Nautical Almanac, and offshore navigational routines for recreational craft. Prerequisite: AP

Navigation - N

This course is the second part of the study of offshore navigation, further developing the understanding of celestial navigation theory.

Prerequisite: Junior Navigation

ELECTIVE COURSES

Cruise Planning

This course is designed for members who plan to cruise for just a weekend or for a year-in either a sail or power boat. It covers the topics of planning, financing, and provisioning a voyage.

Engine Maintenance

This course attempts to make students more self-reliant afloat, with trouble-diagnosis and temporary remedies given special emphasis. It covers marine diesel, gas, and outboard engines, including concepts of operation, maintenance, and repair.

Instructor Qualification

Unlike other USPS courses, this one is not designed to enhance boating skills. Rather it deals with effective communications for speaker and teacher-a quality that benefits the individual in all walks of life.

Marine Electronics

This course teaches essential knowledge about a boat's electrical and electronic systems, including proper wiring, grounding, corrosion and electrolysis control of a boats electronic equipment.

Sail

The Sail course provides a thorough study of the terminology and dynamics of sailing. The topics covered include rigs, rigging and sail plans, techniques of sailing, and safety techniques.

Weather

This is a rigorous course dealing with overall awareness of weather phenomena. One will develop the ability to read the sky as well as a weather map in anticipation of weather developments.

SUPPLEMENTAL PROGRAMS

Supplemental programs have been developed to extend member's knowledge in fields related to boating. Subjects have been selected in areas of expressed interest which include: Boat Design & Construction, Oceanography, Predicted Log Contests, Principles of Water Skiing, Introduction to astronomy, Hand Tools, Compass Adjusting, Boat Insurance, and several others. These home-study guides may be ordered through the SEO or directly from the USPS Ship's Store at USPS headquarters.

MERIT MARKS

USPS offers no monetary compensation to any member just the opportunity to perform a lot of work voluntarily. These services do not go unrecognized though. A member who "performs substantial effort in furthering the interests, programs and objectives of USPS, its Districts and Squadrons, may be awarded a merit mark by the Chief Commander." Each year recommendations are submitted by the Squadron which includes summaries of work performed. They are reviewed by a monitor and forwarded to the Chief Commander. It should be noted that the Chief Commander reviews every submission-usually more than 20,000. Only one merit mark can be awarded in any given year. When a member earns five merit marks he receives the status and right to wear Senior Member insignia. With the award of 25 merit marks, Life Membership is conferred.

CRUISES & RENDEZVOUS

Each year the Squadron plans a variety of cruises for the members to attend. They are located on the Lake Erie, and sometimes other inland and Great Lakes destinations. Generally, they are planned for weekends, beginning Friday evening and wrapping up on Sunday. There is a combination of planned activities and plenty of time for relaxing and exploring at your leisure. A

predetermined number of docks is usually available, so reservations are important. Details are printed in the *LOOKOUT* and are also discussed at the spring meetings.

BOAT/U.S. AFFILIATION

Through an agreement with the Boat Owner's Association of the United States (BOAT/U.S.), we are a Cooperating Group. This means that members of the Sandusky Power Squadron are entitled to membership in BOAT/U. S. for 1/2 of the normal dues rate. Whether renewing or joining as a new member, simply indicate the following on your BOAT/U.S. form: Cooperating Group Number - - GA 80829P.

DISTRICT 29

All squadrons in the USPS are members of a district. SPS is a member of District 29 (D/29). Other D/29 squadrons are: Fort Wayne, Fostoria, Fremont, Lima, Marion, Port Clinton, Columbus, and Toledo. The District is operated in a similar fashion to the squadrons. Business is conducted by a Bridge whose duties mirror those at the squadron level. While squadron officers work under their respective district counterparts, the district officers work under national counterparts.

District meetings are held four times per year - a spring conference, a summer council meeting, a fall conference, and a winter council meeting. The winter council meeting is a business meeting only, while the summer council meeting is conducted during a district rendezvous weekend. The spring and fall conferences are held on Friday evenings through Sunday mornings. Conference locations vary, and each conference is hosted by a different squadron. The host squadron selects a theme to set the tone - such as Mardi gras, country western, or homecoming. Friday evenings are often social times geared to the chosen theme. Saturdays are for seminars and business, with an evening dinner and entertainment. Sundays break. after a continental breakfast.

District 29 publishes a newsletter called *PIER 29*. All members of local squadrons receive this publication 3 times a year. It gives an idea of what other squadron's in the District are doing in addition to Sandusky.

Any squadron member is encouraged to attend the district functions. It's a great opportunity to meet fellow members from other squadrons, and to learn from their experiences.

MEMBERSHIP ENHANCEMENTS

USPS administers several commercial programs that are beneficial to members. Most attractive, perhaps, is the exclusive boat insurance program at very competitive rates. A travel program provides a central agency to secure travel arrangements while generating negotiated commissions to USPS. The USPS credit card program offers a unique "Squadron" Visa card to members at no annual charge, with competitive interest rates.

NATIONAL

The term "National" is used to refer to the parent organization - USPS. It consists of those members who hold National elected and appointed positions as well as those persons who work at our Headquarters building in Raleigh, NC. Many policies and procedures are determined, instituted, and implemented by these people. Most district and squadron practices are derived from guidelines established by National.

There are several National meetings each year. The Annual Meeting is held in January or February, traditionally in a warm-weather locale. There are also spring and fall meetings of the Governing Board. These are held in various cities around the country. Details are published in the ENSIGN the monthly magazine of USPS, which all members receive.

COOPERATIVE CHARTING

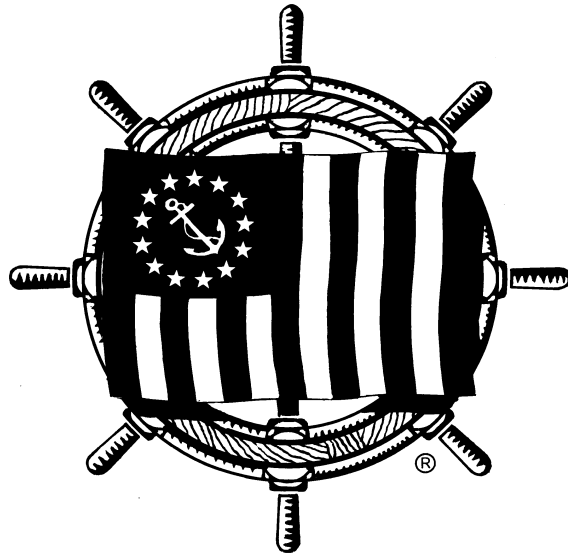
Cooperative Charting is one of the civic service functions of the Squadron. Co-Op charting is our effort to help the National Ocean Service (NOS) to keep updated on changes to the charts of our waterways. Written reports are made of such items as moved or missing buoys, new towers or similar landmarks which can serve as aids to navigation, changes in bridge or locks operations hours or procedures, etc. SPS has a Co-Op Charting chairperson who has the paperwork and can help you provide this valuable service to NOS as well as to your fellow boater.

ELECTIONS

SPS holds its annual elections in conjunction with the January membership meeting. Prior to this meeting the *LOOKOUT* will publish the list of candidates as submitted by the Nominating Committee. Each Active member in good standing is entitled to vote at the January meeting. Elected persons fulfill one-year terms unless otherwise noted, commencing with the February Change-of-Watch meeting.

COMMITTEES

The many activities that SPS conducts require the work and cooperation of many individuals. Many of these activities are coordinated by a Committee Chairperson who takes responsibility for overseeing the successful completion of a given assignment. Often the Chairperson will ask for assistance from other members to accomplish the assigned task. This may occur at a membership meeting, in Lookout articles, or one on one. We need your help and believe that you will find the time well spent. If you have interest in helping with a particular task or committee, contact the Chairperson as listed on the last two pages of the LOOKOUT.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Boating Course - This refers solely to the class which Squadrons teach to non-members as a civic service to their communities. Its purpose is to teach and promote safe boating, and is usually 10-12 weeks.

Boatsmart – This is a shorter version of the Boating Course, usually only 4 weeks.

Bridge - A group of elected officers including: Commander, Executive Officer, Educational Officer, Administrative Officer, Treasurer and Secretary.

Change of Watch - The traditional meeting at which the new Bridge and Executive Committee members are sworn in and officially begin their respective duties. Other awards and recognitions are often acknowledged at this meeting.

ENSIGN - The monthly publication of the USPS, printed 11 times per year.

Ensign of the USPS - a rectangular flag consisting of 13 alternate blue and white vertical stripes of equal width, with a union of a white furl anchor within a circle of 13 white five-pointed stars on a field of red. This ensign is to be displayed only by active members of the USPS.

Executive Committee - Group of elected individuals who meet to discuss and act upon the day-to-day business of the Squadron. The Committee meets the 2nd Monday of the month, prior to the general membership meeting. (except July and August). Committee members include the Bridge, seven elected members and the Immediate Past Commander.

Full Certificate - See Senior Navigator

Grade - The designation which follows a person's name to indicate the highest level of educational achievement that the person has attained. For example, a P is used to indicate the completion of the Piloting course, a JN for the Junior Navigation course, etc.

LOOKOUT - The official monthly publication mailed to SPS members to keep them apprised of the activities of the Sandusky Power Squadron, District, and National organizations.

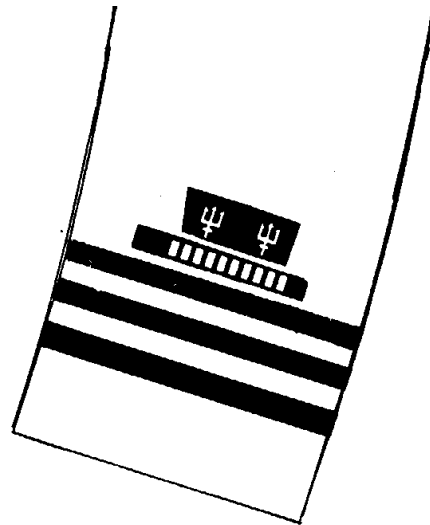
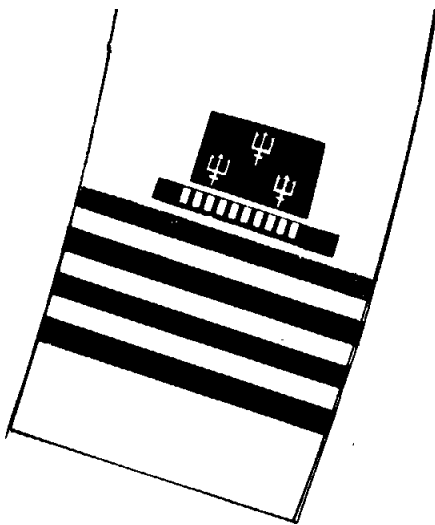
Merit Mark - A merit mark is awarded for recognition of a member's voluntary efforts of behalf of the USPS, District, or Squadron. A member can only earn one merit mark in a given year.

PIER 29 - The newsletter distributed to all members of District 29 to apprise them of the activities at the District level. It is printed three times per year.

Rank - The designation used before a person's name to indicate the level of office that the person holds. For example, appointed committee chairmen are given the rank of Lieutenant, and Bridge Officers are Lieutenant Commanders with the exception of the Commander.

SEO - Squadron Education Officer. Elected officer responsible for all educational courses.

Senior Navigator - The completion of all Advanced and Elective Grade educational courses; designated by SN after the person's name.

The Early Days of The Sandusky Power Squadron

The idea of organizing a unit of The United States Power Squadron in Sandusky was first visualized by Wilbert G. Schwer, after reading an article by Commander William K. Anderson of the Detroit Power Squadron.

After learning from Commander Anderson, the necessary procedure for forming an instruction class in Elementary Piloting and Small Boat Handling, Commander Schwer appeared at the December 1936 meeting of the Sandusky Sailing Club and outlined the requirements for forming a unit of the United States Power Squadron.

An Elementary Class was formed in January 1937, and regular sessions were held in the City Engineer's Building until the course of instruction was completed. Commander Anderson made several trips to Sandusky to help the boys weather the rough going, and on March 12, brought several members of the Detroit Squadron along and administered the final examination.

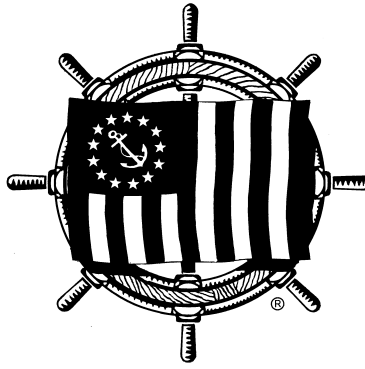
On March 25, 1937 an organization meeting was held and the following officers were elected: Wilbert Schwer, Commander; Earl Seitz, Lt. Commander and Carl Miller, Secretary and Treasurer. William K. Anderson was then elected to Lifetime Honorary Membership in the Sandusky Power Squadron with the rank of Past Commander, in recognition of his aid in forming the Sandusky Squadron.

Inasmuch as the Detroit Squadron was at that time the first and only squadron west of the Appalachians, the Sandusky Squadron holds second place in this distinction.

The official charter granted by the United States Power Squadron, and dated March 25, 1937, may be seen at any time in the tap room of the Sandusky Yacht Club.

The above description was written by Webster C. Gibeaut, Chairman of the Entertainment Committee, for the program of the twenty-fifth anniversary of Sandusky Power Squadron in 1962.

The charter has since been moved to its new home in the main room of the Sandusky Power Squadron Headquarters building.

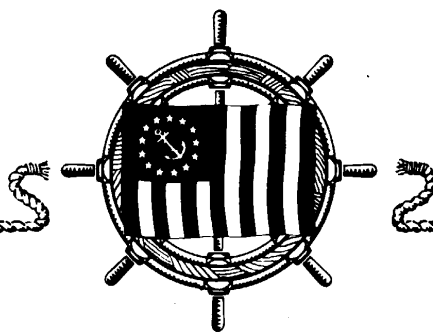

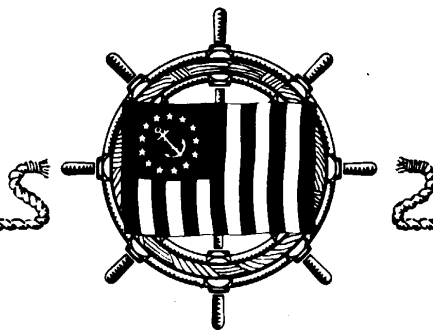

BYLAWS OF
SANDUSKY POWER SQUADRON, INC.
A UNIT OF UNITED STATES POWER SQUADRONS

1ARTICLE

Name

1.1**Section** The name of this organization shall be Sandusky Power Squadron, Inc., constituting a squadron and unit of United States Power Squadrons, a nonprofit organization.

Nonprofit Organization

1.2**Section** This is a nonprofit organization organized under the laws of the State of Ohio, June 3, 1939. The bylaws of United States Power Squadrons and any rules and regulations made pursuant thereto, not inconsistent with federal, state or local laws, shall take precedence over those of this squadron, and all provisions thereof affecting the conduct of the affairs of this squadron shall prevail.

Human Rights Laws

1.3**Section** The squadron and its members shall at all times observe all federal, state and local human rights laws, regulations and ordinances applicable to any squadron activity, procedure or practice. No person may be refused membership, denied office, or be prevented from participating in any activity because of any fact or circumstance which would identify that person as one of a protected class of individuals under the human rights laws, regulations or ordinances of any governmental jurisdiction where the person resides or in which the squadron conducts business.

2ARTICLE

Objects

2.1**Section** The objects of Sandusky Power Squadron shall be:

2.1.1 To selectively associate congenial persons of good character having a

common love and appreciation of yachting as a nationwide fraternity of boatmen;

2.1.2 To encourage and promote yachting, power and sail, and to provide through local squadrons and otherwise a practical means to foster fraternal and social relationships among persons interested in yachting;

2.1.3 To encourage and promote a high amateur standard of skill in the handling and navigation of yachts, power and sail; to encourage and promote the study of the science and art of navigation, seamanship and small boat handling; to develop and promote instructional programs for the benefit of members; and to stimulate members to increase their knowledge of and skill in yachting through instruction, self-education, and participation in marine sports activities and competitions;

2.1.4 To encourage its members to abide by recognized yachting traditions, customs and etiquette; and

2.1.5 To render, and encourage its members to render, such altruistic, patriotic or other civic service as it may from time to time determine or elect.

2.1.6

Word and Term Meaning

2.2Section As used herein, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the term:

2.2.1 *USPS* means United States Power Squadrons.

2.2.2 *District* means a district of USPS.

2.2.3 *Squadron* means this squadron.

2.2.4 *Members, officers, committees, delegates* and subjects treated generally refer to and mean those of this squadron.

2.2.5 *Policy and authority of USPS* refers to and means the bylaws of USPS, the policies adopted by the USPS Governing Board, and the current USPS *Operations Manual* which supplements these documents.

2.3Section Any word denoting gender used in these bylaws shall apply equally to either gender as the context may require.

3ARTICLE

Membership

3.1**Section** Membership in USPS and in this squadron is a privilege, not a right, and shall be by application and contingent upon meeting eligibility requirements as set forth in the bylaws of USPS. Admission to membership in USPS is a function of the USPS Governing Board and is delegated to the squadron Executive Committee subject to the policy and authority of USPS. No membership shall be valid unless the member meets and continues to meet the factual requirements of membership in USPS according to the policy and authority of USPS and of this squadron. Any prospective member shall be expected to be able and willing to contribute energy and skill to the objects of this squadron and USPS.

3.2**Section** There shall be the following classes of membership: active members, family members, associate members, and honorary members.

3.3**Section** The active members of this squadron shall consist of persons who meet membership qualifications set forth by the policy and authority of USPS and who are admitted to membership as herein provided.

3.4**Section** An active member who has been awarded 25 merit marks shall become a life member. Life members shall be exempt from further payment of squadron dues and shall receive such other exemptions in this squadron as are appropriate to match those granted by USPS.

3.5**Section** Family members of this squadron may be admitted in the same manner as active members. Persons eligible to be admitted as family members shall consist of persons related to an active member by blood, legal adoption or marriage and who reside with or are dependents of such active member. Family members shall enjoy only such privileges as are in accordance with the policy and authority of USPS.

3.6**Section** Associate members of this squadron shall consist of active members in good standing of other squadrons of USPS, or of the Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons, who have been granted associate membership by the Executive Committee. Associate members shall have all of the privileges of active members except that they shall not hold elective office in this squadron, have representation by delegates of this squadron, be entitled to represent this squadron at any USPS or district meeting, or be entitled to vote at any meeting of this squadron.

3.7**Section** Honorary membership may be conferred by the Executive Committee, for not more than one year at a time, upon any person not a member of USPS who has rendered conspicuous service in the interest of this squadron. Honorary members shall not be subject to the payment of entrance fees and dues. Honorary members shall not have any of the privileges extended to other classes of members except that they may wear the USPS membership lapel pin.

3.8Section No blanket invitation to membership may be made by any person to any group of persons.

3.9Section An application for membership in this squadron must have been endorsed by one or more active members and must have been evaluated by the Membership Committee before being presented to the Executive Committee for final action. Admission to any class of membership in this squadron shall require a majority vote of the Executive Committee members present and voting at a duly constituted meeting of said committee.

3.10Section No member of the Executive Committee or of the Membership Committee shall disclose any member's vote, or make any comment on or discuss outside the committees' meetings any application to membership. No one may disclose the name of any person considered for membership to anyone not an active member of this squadron. No one shall be entitled to receive information from any member of the Executive Committee or of the Membership Committee concerning the approval or disapproval of application of any person to membership in this squadron and USPS, except that a member proposing a person for membership shall be informed by the Membership Committee as to the status of the proposal.

3.11Section The classification of members and the educational grade of members attaining advanced grades shall be in accordance with the policy and authority of USPS.

4ARTICLE

Apprentices

4.1Section Upon approval of an application by a majority vote of the Executive Committee members present and voting at a duly constituted meeting of said committee, persons who: (1) do not otherwise qualify for any class of membership; (2) have passed an examination approved by the Operating Committee; and (3) have attained the age of 12, may become associated with this squadron as apprentices for a period of time not to extend beyond the end of the dues year in which they reach their 18th birthday.

4.2Section Apprentices associated with this squadron shall have only such privileges, shall be subject to such limitations and conditions, and shall pay such fees as are set forth by the policy and authority of USPS and of this squadron.

5ARTICLE

Officers and Committees

General Provisions

5.1 **Section** Elected officers, elected committee chairmen and committee members, and all appointees, shall be subject to the following general provisions:

5.1.1 All elected officers, elected chairmen, committee members, and all appointees shall be active members of this squadron.

5.1.2 All bridge officers shall have been awarded at least one advanced grade and at least one merit mark. This requirement may be waived by the district commander for good cause in accordance with USPS *Bylaws* Section 7.9.

5.1.3 Except as otherwise provided in these bylaws, all officers, committee members, and appointees shall: (1) be elected or appointed annually; (2) serve for one year or until their successors are elected or appointed, or if applicable, installed; and (3) begin their term of office at the time at which they are elected or appointed, or if applicable, installed.

5.1.4 No active member shall be nominated for or hold more than one elective *flag* office in USPS simultaneously, except as provided in herein or for a short *lame duck* period due to overlapping terms of office. More than one elective position other than flag office may be held if there does not appear to be a conflict of interest.

5.1.5 No individual shall be eligible for election to the office of commander for more than two consecutive terms of one year each.

5.1.6 Committees whose members have staggered terms shall have members elected or appointed initially for terms to meet such qualifications. One of the members whose term next expires shall be nominated and elected, or appointed, chairman, as appropriate.

5.1.7 A vacancy occurring in any elective office shall be filled by the Executive Committee until the next annual meeting of this squadron, and a vacancy occurring in any appointive office shall be filled by appointment by the commander. Persons selected to fill vacancies in the offices of educational officer and assistant educational officer must have their qualifications approved as provided in herein.

5.1.8 In all instances relating to rank, grade, appointment, duties and

procedures, the policy and authority of USPS shall prevail.

5.1.9 Upon leaving office, elected and appointed officers and committee chairmen shall turn over to their successors all records, reports, communications and documents in their possession and pertaining to the affairs of this squadron.

5.1.10 In the event the commander, the executive officer, or the administrative officer is determined, by self-declaration or by two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee, to be incapable of performing the duties of office because of illness or otherwise, the Executive Committee may assign the duties and powers of such office to a past commander agreeable to serve. Such assumption of duties by a past commander shall last only until the earliest of: (1) the next annual meeting of this squadron; (2) the officer rescinds the self-declaration of incapability; (3) the Executive Committee rescinds its declaration of incapability; or (4) the next squadron meeting at least 50 days after the declaration of incapability at which meeting the Executive Committee shall recommend to the membership whether the period of incapability should be extended or the office declared vacant.

Elected Officers and Committees

5.2**Section** The elected bridge officers of this squadron shall be the commander, who shall be the ranking officer, the executive officer, the educational officer, the administrative officer, the secretary and the treasurer, which officers shall be elected by the active members at the annual meeting each year. The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person if so authorized by the Executive Committee.

Elected Assistants

5.3**Section** The Executive Committee may authorize election of an assistant educational officer, an assistant secretary, and/or an assistant treasurer. Any such officers shall assist their principals and, in the absence or incapacity of their principals, act in the principals' stead, including voting at any meeting.

Elected Committees

5.4**Section** There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the Commander, the Executive Officer, the Educational Officer, the Administrative Officer, the Secretary, the Treasurer, the Immediate Past Commander, and seven active members from the general membership of the Squadron nominated for such position by the Nominating Committee and elected by the Active Members of the Squadron at the Annual Meeting each year.

Inasmuch as Section 5.4 of Article 5, providing for an Executive Committee, was known as

Section 2 of Article IV in the original Bylaws of this Squadron, it is expressly understood that, when Article IV of the Articles of Incorporation of Sandusky Power Squadron states that "The persons elected to the Executive Committee of said corporation, as provided in Article IV, Section 2, of the Bylaws thereof, shall, ex officio, be the Trustees of said Corporation, it shall mean, from and after the adoption of these Amended Bylaws, that those persons constituting the Executive Committee pursuant to Section 5.4 of Article 5 of these Amended Bylaws shall, ex officio, be the Trustees of Sandusky Power Squadron, Incorporated."

5.5Section There shall be a Nominating Committee , consisting of a chairman and two other members, one of whom shall be elected by the active members at the annual meeting each year for a term of three years.

5.6Section There shall be a Rules Committee , consisting of a chairman and two other members, one of whom shall be elected by the active members at the annual meeting each year for a term of three years.

5.7Section There shall be an Auditing Committee , consisting of a chairman and two other members, one of whom shall be elected by the active members at the annual meeting each year for a term of three years.

Section 5.8 There shall be a Planning Committee composed of five members, consisting of a chairman and four other members, one of whom shall be elected by the active members at the annual meeting each year for a term of five years. It shall study matters concerning the general welfare of this squadron and make recommendations thereon to the Executive Committee. Items for study may be referred to it by the Commander, the Executive Committee, or the membership, or as may arise within the Planning Committee itself. It shall file an annual report with the Executive Committee at its meeting preceding the annual meeting.

Appointed Committees

Section 5.9 Certain appointed committees shall report to the commander or their respective department heads as required or directed.

5.9.1 The Membership Committee shall be composed of at least one member appointed annually by the commander. It shall be familiar with the policies and procedures outlined in the current edition of the USPS *Membership Manual*, shall process all new member applications, and shall present to the Executive Committee an evaluation of every person applying for squadron membership.

5.9.2 The Member Involvement Committee shall be composed of at least one member appointed annually by the commander. It shall ensure that all members are kept aware of the educational, service, and social activities of this squadron and shall work closely with the Membership Committee to ensure that new members become quickly involved in squadron

activities.

5.9.3 The Local Boards of the Educational Department shall be appointed by the commander after consultation with the educational officer. They shall perform such duties as are outlined by the policy and authority of USPS and as may be directed by the educational officer, and shall make such reports as may be requested by the commander or by the educational officer.

5.9.4 The Educational Committee shall be composed of the educational officer, the assistant educational officer, the chairmen of the Local Boards and the class chairmen. It shall make recommendations to the commander concerning squadron educational programs and perform such other duties as are incidental to the squadron's educational programs.

5.9.5 The Merit Mark Committee shall be composed of three members made up of the three Immediate Past Commanders. The Chairman shall be the member serving the last year of his term. Each year the Immediate Past Commander shall become a member of the committee to replace the retired member. It shall compile and correlate data to assist the Commander in Merit Mark recommendations. If three Past Commanders are not available, then those available shall comprise the Committee.

5.9.6 There shall be a Housing Committee consisting of a chairman and two other members, one of whom shall be appointed by the Commander each year, for a term of three years, to replace the outgoing member. The member in his last year on the committee shall serve as chairman. The Housing Committee shall oversee and direct all activities of, including care and maintenance of the Squadron Building.

5.9.7 The Personnel Committee shall be composed of at least one member appointed annually by the commander. It shall maintain an inventory of the skills of each member so that these skills may be called upon for staff positions, committee chairmen, committee members, etc.

5.9.8 The Finance Committee shall be composed of three members, one of which shall be appointed each year by the Commander for a term of three years. The Finance Committee shall work in close cooperation with the Treasurer, prepare the budget, and, in general, plan the overall financial affairs of the Squadron. It is the responsibility of this committee to annually present a budget to the Executive Committee for approval prior to its being presented to the active members for approval.

5.9.9 Other committees, consisting of those customarily assigned to the various departments of this squadron by the policy and authority of USPS, shall perform such duties as are usual for their particular operation and as may be directed by their department heads, and shall make such reports as are required by their operations.

Other Appointed Officers

Section 5.10 The commander may appoint a law officer who should be an attorney at law, authorized to practice as such. The law officer shall perform such legal duties as may be assigned by the commander or by the Executive Committee and which concern the affairs of this squadron and its district and USPS affiliations.

Section 5.11 The commander may appoint a supply officer who shall have charge of the procurement and sale to qualified members of ensigns, insignia and other paraphernalia approved by USPS. The supply officer shall be responsible to the treasurer for all funds received from the sale of supplies.

Section 5.12 The commander may appoint a property officer who shall have responsibility for all squadron property which is not procured for resale to members and who shall maintain a current listing of such property showing location, date procured, and condition. A copy of the listing shall be supplied to the treasurer upon request.

Section 5.13 The commander may appoint a chaplain, a flag lieutenant, and such other aides or lieutenants as are deemed necessary, to perform such duties as the commander or the Executive Committee may assign.

6ARTICLE

Duties and Powers of Officers and Committees

6.1**Section** The commander shall be the ranking Officer of the Squadron and shall be *ex officio* President of the Corporation. He shall:

- 6.1.1 Preside at all meetings of this squadron and its Executive Committee.
- 6.1.2 Execute all written instruments in the name of this squadron when directed by the Executive Committee or by the membership.
- 6.1.3 Have command of the fleet when the vessels of this squadron are formally assembled.
- 6.1.4 Appoint, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee, appointive officers and the chairmen and members of the appointive committees.
- 6.1.5 Be an *ex officio* member of all committees and boards of this squadron except the Nominating, Rules, and Auditing Committees.
- 6.1.6 Make recommendations for membership on USPS committees and for national and district offices, and make reports to national and district officers as

required by the policy and authority of USPS and the district.

6.1.7 Appoint, with the advice and approval of the Executive Committee, delegates to the conferences of the district and to the annual and special meetings of USPS.

6.1.8 Determine the times and places for instruction in the Educational Course of USPS, after consultation with the Education Officer, and subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

6.1.9 Turn over to his successor, at the expiration of his term of office, all records, reports, communications, and documents pertaining to the affairs of the squadron.

6.1.10 Perform generally the duties required by law of the President of an Ohio Corporation not for profit.

6.2Section The executive officer shall assist the commander in the general discharge of his duties and, in the Commander's temporary absence or incapacity, act in his place and stead. He shall succeed to the Office of Commander should a vacancy occur in that office other than by expiration of the term of office. The following Committees, by way of illustration by not limitation, shall report to him: Safety, Legislative, Cooperative Charting, National Liaison, Public Relations, Radio Technical, Boat Show, Blessing of the Fleet, Environmental, Hospitality, and Photographer. He shall be an *ex officio* member of all of these committees. At the expiration of his term of office, he shall turn over to his successor all records, reports, communications, and documents pertaining to the affairs of the Squadron.

6.3Section The educational officer shall assist the commander in the discharge of his duties and shall be the head of the Squadron's Educational Department. The Educational Officer shall perform such duties as prescribed for this office by the policy and authority of USPS. At the expiration of his term of office, he shall turn over to his successor all records, reports, communications and documents pertaining to the affairs of the Squadron.

6.4Section The administrative officer shall: (1) assist the commander; (2) have general supervision of the Administrative Department as directed by the membership, the commander, or the Executive Committee; (3) be an *ex officio* member of all committees of the Administrative Department including but not limited to Membership, Operations Training, Boating Activities, Meetings and Programs, Member Involvement, Entertainment, Advertising, Personnel, Information Systems, and Collating; and (4) in the temporary absence or incapacity of the executive officer, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the executive officer. He shall succeed to the office of Executive Officer should a vacancy occur in that office other than by expiration of the term of office. At the expiration of his term of office, he shall turn over to his successor all records, reports, communications and documents pertaining to the affairs of the Squadron.

6.5 Section The secretary shall:

6.5.1 Have custody of all corporate records, bylaws, and the corporate seal of this squadron.

6.5.2 Attest to and affix the corporate seal to written instruments when so directed by the Executive Committee.

6.5.3 Keep a record of all proceedings of this squadron and of the Executive Committee, of the attendance at Executive Committee meetings and of all matters of which a record may be deemed advisable, in books belonging to this squadron, which records shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any active member of this squadron. No detailed records shall be kept relating to votes on applications for membership.

6.5.4 Keep an up-to-date record of all members of this squadron, including for each member: name, address, telephone number, certificate date and number, type of membership, rank, grade, merit marks, senior membership date, vessel data and other pertinent information.

6.5.5 Keep and preserve all documents, records, reports and official correspondence connected with the business of this squadron.

6.5.6 Report to the national secretary the names and addresses of members elected to this squadron, any changes in membership or addresses of members, and the election of officers.

6.5.7 Send the required notices of all squadron and Executive Committee meetings and all lists of candidates for office to be voted upon at any election.

6.5.8 Make a report at the annual meeting and at such other times as the commander or the Executive Committee may request.

6.5.9 Perform such other appropriate duties as may be assigned by the commander or the Executive Committee or as may be required by the policy and authority of USPS.

6.5.10 Be an *ex officio* member of all committees and boards under the Secretary's Department which include but are not limited to: Lookout Editor, Ensign Correspondent, and Squadron Historian.

6.5.11 Turn over to his successor, at the expiration of his term of office, all records, books, reports, communications and documents pertaining to the affairs of

the Squadron.

6.6Section The treasurer shall:

6.6.1 Collect and hold, in the name of this squadron, all moneys belonging to this squadron including but not limited to dues, fees, education charges, supplies, advertising income, and any funds turned over to him from meetings, dinners, and other functions sponsored by the Squadron.

6.6.2 Pay all bills contracted by this squadron which have been approved by the Executive Committee or by the head of a department or the chairman of a committee which has contracted the same by virtue of appropriations made by the Executive Committee or by the adopted budget.

6.6.3 Make interim reports, including statements of receipts, disbursements, and financial condition, at such times as the commander or the Executive Committee may direct and, prepare an annual report as of the last day of the squadron's fiscal (business) year.

6.6.3.1 Submit Annual Report to the Auditing Committee, together with the books and records of his office, for examination.

6.6.4 Keep a true and complete record of all monies and property of this Squadron received by him, and the disposition made by him thereof, and keep such accounts and records as are appropriate and reasonable requested by the Executive Committee.

6.6.5 Unless sent to each member by USPS, send to the last known address of each member at such time as the policy and authority of USPS may direct, a bill for the member's dues for the following USPS dues year.

6.6.6 No later than 15 days prior to the end of the current dues year, notify all members whose following year dues have not been received that, should such dues be unpaid two weeks after the beginning of the following dues year, their membership shall be terminated without further notice.

6.6.7 Promptly send moneys due USPS to headquarters and report to the national treasurer the names of all members of this squadron in arrears according to the schedule set forth by the policy and authority of USPS.

6.6.8 Pay to the district of which this squadron is a member the annual district assessment, if any, based on such membership statistics, at such time and in such manner as directed by the district.

6.6.9 Prepare and file, in a timely manner, all required federal, state, and local tax and information returns, following the recommendations and instructions of the national treasurer.

6.6.10 Perform such other appropriate duties incident to the office as are required by the policy and authority of USPS, or as the commander or the Executive Committee may direct.

6.6.11 Be an *ex officio* member of all committees and boards in the Treasurer's Department including but not limited to Supply Officer, and Property Officer.

6.6.12 Turn over to his successor, at the expiration of his term of office, all records, reports, communications, documents, monies, and things of whatsoever sort pertaining to his office and belonging to the Squadron.

Executive Committee

6.7Section The Executive Committee, also known as the Board of Directors, shall:

6.7.1 Meet monthly at least ten months per year, have general charge of the policy, management and finances of this squadron, be vested with and have legal custody of all squadron property, and appropriate such sums as may be deemed advisable, within the limits of squadron resources, for the normal and usual operation of this squadron, including squadron, district and USPS functions.

6.7.2 Approve applications for all classes of squadron membership.

6.7.3 Carry on the normal business of this squadron between meetings of the membership.

6.7.4 Establish committees and appoint members thereto as may seem advisable and in the best interests of this squadron.

6.7.5 Consult with and advise the commander regarding appointments to squadron offices and committees.

6.7.6 With the advice of the treasurer, designate depositories insured by an agency of the U.S. government in which squadron funds shall be kept, and approve the budget for submission to the members.

6.7.7 Enforce the authority given it under these bylaws and take any necessary action consistent with the policy and authority of USPS to advance the best interests of this squadron.

6.7.8 With the assistance and cooperation of the Educational Department, determine which courses and programs are to be offered during the squadron teaching year, and the times and locations thereof.

6.7.9 Invite the law officer to its meetings when legal expertise is desirable. The law officer shall be entitled to speak at such meetings but shall not be entitled to vote.

General Committees

Section

The Nominating Committee shall select a candidate for each elective office and for the chairman and members of each elective committee provided for herein, and shall submit its written report to the secretary at least 40 days prior to the annual meeting.

6.7.10 Other than interviews with potential nominees, no member of this committee shall comment upon or discuss committee business with any non-member of this committee and, other than the nominations report, no non-member of this committee shall be entitled to receive any information concerning the committee's deliberations.

6.7.11 No member of this committee whose term is expiring shall be re-nominated to this committee and no member of this committee shall be eligible for nomination and election to any bridge office as defined in herein, for the term of one year after his/her term expires on the Nominating Committee.

6.8**Section** The Rules Committee shall be the guardian of adherence to the USPS *Bylaws*, USPS policy, district bylaws, and squadron bylaws. The committee shall be familiar with the current edition of the *Model Bylaws for Squadrons of USPS* and prepare recommendations as necessary to keep this squadron's bylaws consistent with the policy and authority of USPS. It shall prepare the wording of proposed amendments as may be directed by the Executive Committee or by the membership.

6.9**Section** The Auditing Committee shall examine all records of the treasurer as of the last day of the squadron fiscal year and submit a report of its findings for action by a membership meeting not more than 60 days after the end of the fiscal year. An additional audit shall be performed should a different individual assume the office of treasurer prior to the end of the fiscal year.

7ARTICLE

Dues and Entrance Fees

7.1**Section** The entrance fees and annual dues of dues-paying classes of membership shall be reviewed each year by the Executive Committee, and its recommendations for the following year shall be presented to and voted upon by the active members no later than the last regular squadron meeting prior to 1 February. Such fees and dues shall be as so determined provided, however, that in the event no such fees or dues are so fixed for any USPS dues year, fees and dues shall be the same as for the preceding year.

7.2**Section** The dues of this squadron shall be due and payable, in advance, at the same time as USPS dues are due and payable.

7.3**Section** An entrance fee, in an amount recommended by the Executive Committee and approved by the active members, may be required as a prerequisite to any class of membership except honorary membership. Such entrance fee shall be paid at the time of acceptance of the individual into membership.

7.4**Section** Dues for new members shall be prorated on a monthly basis from the first day of the month in which the applicant signs and dates the acceptance of membership form to the end of the dues year.

7.5**Section** Non-payment of squadron dues may be excused by the Executive Committee, but nothing herein contained shall authorize the waiver of dues to USPS or of any district assessment.

7.6**Section** Members of all classes of USPS membership otherwise eligible to receive instruction or examination in any course may not do so unless in good standing and not in arrears for dues or other indebtedness to this squadron or USPS.

8ARTICLE

Resignations, Transfers and Reinstatements

8.1**Section** Resignations, transfers and reinstatements shall be accomplished in accordance with the policy and authority of USPS.

9ARTICLE

Meetings, Notices and Quorums

9.1Section Regular squadron business meetings shall be held on the second Monday of each month, from September to June of the following year, inclusive, at a regular meeting place. The Executive Committee may designate other times and places for such regular business meetings upon proper notice. The Executive Committee shall meet as required by herein.

9.2Section If a holiday or other circumstance makes it impractical to hold any meeting as provided herein, the Executive Committee may waive such meeting or set another meeting date. The membership shall be notified accordingly.

9.3Section The annual meeting shall be held in the month of January, at such time and place as the Executive Committee may designate, at which time an election of officers and members of elective committees, including the chairmen thereof, shall be held. Written notice of the annual meeting, containing a list of all active members nominated by the Nominating Committee for election to positions within this squadron, shall be sent to each active member by regular monthly publication, in such manner as determined by the Executive Committee, at least three weeks prior to such meeting.

9.4Section The secretary shall provide a list of all nominees by petition as provided by 11.1 herein and shall give notice thereof to all active members in such manner that it will reach them at least ten days prior to the date of the election.

9.5Section At the discretion of the commander or the Executive Committee, special membership meetings may be called at any reasonable time, and shall be called by the secretary upon written request of 10 or more active members. Special meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by the commander or upon written request by five or more members of the Executive Committee.

9.6Section Except as provided in herein, notices of all regular and special meetings of this squadron and of the Executive Committee shall be mailed to the last known address of each member entitled to receive such notice at least 10 days prior to regular meetings, and at least 5 days prior to special meetings. The inclusion of a *Notice of Meeting* in an official squadron publication mailed the required time before such meeting will be deemed to comply with the foregoing provisions.

9.7Section At any regular or special meeting, 10 per cent of the active members, as determined by the records of this squadron, shall constitute a quorum.

9.8Section A quorum for any committee of more than two persons shall be a majority of its members.

9.9Section Voting at regular and special meetings shall be as follows:

9.9.1 Each active member present and in good standing in this squadron shall have one vote on each question.

9.9.2 Voting shall be by voice unless a poll is demanded by an active member duly qualified to vote, in which event votes shall be cast by a show of hands. Upon a motion supported by at least one-fifth of the active members present and voting, a roll call vote shall be held. The presiding officer may require that voting be by secret ballot if circumstances warrant.

9.9.3 The presiding officer shall vote only when necessary to decide a tie.

9.9.4 Voting at an election shall be as provided in herein.

10ARTICLE

Order of Business and Rules of Order

10.1Section Unless otherwise provided by the active members or by the presiding officer at the outset of the meeting, the following order of business shall be observed at all meetings of the membership and the Executive Committee:

10.1.1 Invocation.

10.1.2 Pledge of Allegiance.

10.1.3 Approval of the minutes of the preceding meeting.

10.1.4 Reports of officers.

10.1.5 Reports of committees.

10.1.6 Communications.

10.1.7 Unfinished business.

10.1.8 Election of officers (if any to be elected).

10.1.9 New business.

10.1.10 Adjournment.

10.2Section Orderly parliamentary procedure shall govern at all meetings. All questions of procedure not otherwise covered herein or by the policy and authority of USPS shall be determined by the Parliamentarian, in accordance with the most current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*.

Section 10.3 At the Annual Meeting, if appropriate, but in any event no later than the first Membership meeting not more than sixty days after the date of examination, appropriate action shall be taken upon the report of the Auditing Committee before the annual report of the Treasurer shall be filed.

11ARTICLE

Nominations, Elections and Voting

11.1Section Candidates for office to be voted upon at the annual meeting may be nominated (1) by the Nominating Committee as herein provided or (2) by petition in writing signed by at least five active members in good standing and filed with the secretary at least 15 days before the date of election.

11.2Section The educational officer and the assistant educational officer are members of the USPS Educational Department, and shall be nominated and elected only after their qualifications have been approved by the national educational officer's designee.

11.3Section If vacancies exist in the properly formulated slate of nominees at the time of the election, they shall be filled by nominations from the floor duly made by active members.

11.4Section No active member shall be eligible for nomination without first signifying willingness and ability to serve if elected.

11.5Section At any election, each active member present and in good standing in this squadron shall have one vote for each office to be filled. Voting shall be in the following manner:

11.5.1 Each active member, and only Active Members, shall have one vote for each office to be filled. Votes by proxy or cumulative voting shall not be permitted.

11.5.2 Election to an uncontested office may be effected by a supported motion and a ballot cast and recorded by the secretary.

11.5.3 Election to a contested office shall be effected by secret ballot, unsigned and cast in person. Such elections shall be determined by a judge of election and not less than three tellers, all of who shall be appointed by the commander. The secret ballots shall be delivered to the judge of election and opened and inspected

by the tellers, and the final results shall be tabulated and announced to the members before the close of the meeting.

11.5.4 Polls shall remain open for no more than one hour after the election is initiated as an order of business.

12ARTICLE

Miscellaneous

12.1**Section** Any person collecting moneys for any activity of this squadron shall be prepared at all times to make a full and complete accounting of the same to the commander and to the Executive Committee.

12.2**Section** No officer or member shall contract any bills in the name of this squadron unless previously authorized by the Executive Committee or by the adopted budget.

12.3**Section** When any account authorized by the Executive Committee or by the adopted budget is closed, any excess funds therein and a complete accounting shall be promptly turned over to the treasurer.

12.4**Section** No person shall take advantage of USPS membership status in order to achieve personal gain or remuneration which would otherwise be unavailable.

12.5**Section** The squadron fiscal (business) year shall be for 12 consecutive months beginning on 1 February and ending on the last day of January.

12.6**Section** All publications or notices of any nature issued by this squadron shall have the prior approval of the commander or the Executive Committee before being sent to members or to the public.

13ARTICLE

Discipline

13.1**Section** Matters of discipline shall be considered and handled in accordance with the policy and authority of USPS.

14 ARTICLE

Flags, Uniforms, Insignia and Etiquette

14.1 Section Flags, uniforms, insignia and matters of etiquette shall conform to the policy and authority of USPS.

15 ARTICLE

Squadron Publication

15.1 Section The official squadron publication shall be known as "The Lookout."

16 ARTICLE

Distribution of Assets After Termination

16.1 Section No member of this squadron shall have, as an individual, any interest in or title to the assets of USPS or of any district or squadron, and such assets shall be devoted exclusively to the purposes of USPS, the district or this squadron.

16.2 Section In the event of dissolution and voluntary surrender, or of revocation of this squadron's charter, all assets then belonging to this squadron shall be assigned to USPS or to another organization which qualifies for tax exemption (under Section 501(c)(3) of the *Internal Revenue Code of 1986*, as from time to time amended, and any rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, or such other section of the code by which USPS is exempt) as selected by the Executive Committee or other comparable body of this squadron. If no such body exists or no selection is made, the assets of this squadron shall be assigned to USPS.

17 ARTICLE

Amendments

17.1 Section These bylaws may be amended, subject to the approval of the USPS Committee on Rules, by a two-thirds vote of the active members present and voting at any regular or special squadron meeting, provided that a quorum is present at the time the vote is taken AND (1) the proposed amendments are stated in full in the notice of the meeting at which action is to be taken thereon, or (2) an announcement of the proposed amendments was given to each member and multiple copies of the old and the proposed bylaws are made available to the members at two or more consecutive general membership meetings at least 20 days apart (the last such meeting may be the meeting at which the vote is taken).

17.2Section When proposed amendments are properly before any meeting for consideration, they may, before final action is taken thereon, be changed by a majority vote, provided the change is germane to the subject of the amendment under consideration.

17.3Section Amendments to these bylaws shall not become effective until approved by the USPS Committee on Rules and notice of such approval is provided to each active member. Notice of approval in the squadron publication, duly issued and circulated, shall fulfill the above requirement.

18ARTICLE

Corporate Seal

18.1Section The Corporate Seal of this squadron shall be circular in shape and have inscribed thereon "SANDUSKY POWER SQUADRON, INC." and "SANDUSKY, OHIO" surrounding the words "CORPORATE SEAL".

ARTICLE 19

Section 19.1 Officers and committee members of this Squadron shall be held harmless from the consequences of any official act by them done in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of USPS to the extent of any policy of insurance carried by the Squadron covering such official acts.
