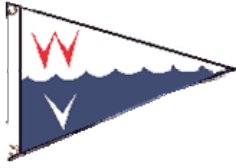

“A Mariner’s Weekend” Four District Conference Held at The Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole, MA

Since the mid 1990’s there have been three previous multi-district conferences in the northeast involving Districts 12, 14, 18 and 19. All of these conferences were hugely successful and well attended. The Woods Hole Four District Conference, held from 9-11 November continued that tradition with a plus.

We are all aware of recent changes in our National organization’s structure to streamline and reduce expense. One such expense is the conduction of Operational Committee or OCOM meetings. This is analogous to squadron and district executive committee meetings, but on a national scale. Traditionally, district conferences have had attendance from one OCOM person representing the Chief Commander. Our Four District event allowed OCOM to schedule their regular meeting in Woods Hole and the entire Operating Committee to attend our conference and to interact with members at the conference from four northeast districts.

Saturday’s seminars included such programs as “Global Warming – Fact or Fiction, Naval Architecture – Perspectives for the Recreational Boater, Trends in Digital Charting, Navigation through the Ages, Biological Camouflage – Nature’s Way of Hiding, and Boat Operator Certification.” On Sunday, there was a town meeting style gathering where the entire national bridge and the remaining members of OCOM addressed member questions in an open forum. Many of us who have had the opportunity to attend national meeting know that our national officers are simply members like us. This open forum allowed many members who previously had been unable to attend a national meeting to meet the national bridge members face to face and a wonderful opportunity to hear from them and to share ideas.

At District 19’s Conference meeting, our amended District bylaws were discussed and with minor adjustments, accepted. A mission statement was also adopted.

District 19 was one of only four districts in the whole of USPS to be awarded the Bowsprit for achieving several nationally set goals.

- Winooski Valley Sail and Power Squadron, along with the other nine squadrons in D/19 received a certificate of achievement in recognition of this award.
- Winooski Valley also received our 14th certificate in recognition of our participation in the Education Fund.

Both of these events expose our squadron to the general public. Remember our main message is "We are the largest group offering marine education." There will be additional courses for our members offered this year, so watch for announcements from our education department.

The squadron decided to adjust our membership dues to reflect the pattern established by National. We will have two categories of dues: Single, for those needing it and Family for all others. We want to include all family members in our activities and the family membership will help do that.

We will have a tri-fold display for the boat show(s) etc. The center section will be 4x4 and the two sides 2x4. The color will be blue felt. All information will be attached using the hook and loop or sandpaper. Our booth will include the large Winooski Valley Sail and Power Squadron burgee, the USPS flag, the banner, and additional announcements and folders. Winooski Valley Sail & Power Squadron Awarded the Roger Upton Award at the Norfolk National Meeting

Let's face it, Winooski Valley squadron and USPS seem to be unknown in our community in spite of our attempts to turn that around. In Vermont, we are fortunate to have a Public Access television opportunity where local, non-professionals can receive air time. Our Executive Committee was receptive and supported an idea to create a video to be viewed on public access TV across Vermont. LCATV was contacted and helped with equipment, technical, copy and distribution support.

We used this opportunity to create a script and engage members of Winooski Valley as players. Utilizing the USPS 2nd National Safe Boating Test video as a backdrop, WVSPS content was created and added to introduce the USPS video and to follow up at the end with more description of USPS and WVSPS. A DVD was created and mailed to 19 Public Access station across Vermont. It played on many of them and you may have seen it.

National's PR Committee annually evaluates contributions from across USPS and our video was entered in the video competition know as the Roger Upton Award. **Our squadron entry was awarded first place** at the Norfolk Governing Board meeting. There is another such opportunity we may need help with in spring 2008.

His presentation described the Grand Canal Journey of the Lois McClure from Lake Champlain, through the Champlain Canal and the Erie Canal. It was a wonderful program and as always the food was amazing!



EDUCATION DEPARTMENT NEWS

We have an exciting year ahead of us. First, is the Boat Operator Certification Program. The program would certify USPS members at various levels of recreational boating proficiency. The United States Coast Guard has asked Congress to pass legislation that would effectively require all boaters to be certified. Also, although the United States has not yet signed, the United Nations has passed Resolution 40, *International Certificate for the Operation of Pleasure Craft*, which would require the same for all boaters in international waters. The USPS program would meet or exceed the Coast Guard or United Nation requirements.

There are four levels of certification: Inland Navigator, Coastal Navigator, Advanced Coastal Navigator, and Offshore Navigator. To be certified, a member must be at least 16 years of age, be mentally and physically capable of operating a boat, and have sufficient visual and auditory sensory ability to do so. Holding a drivers license will suffice to certify meeting these requirements.

The other requirements are completion of USPS courses prescribed for each level, completion of USPS seminars prescribed for each level, and a skill demonstration showing that the individual has demonstrated prescribed skills on the water or in certain cases, on land.

For example, an Inland Navigator certifies the member for:

- Boat operations in rivers, canals, small lakes, and protected waters within 2 nm of shore
- Using the members own boat up to 8M (26.2 feet) LOA
- Operation during daylight hours with good visibility and fair weather
- Winds not to exceed Force 4 (16 Kt or 18 mph)
- Waves not to exceed 1 meter (3.1 Ft)

As an Inland Navigator you would need to complete the following courses and seminars:

- A NASBLA approved boating course
- Seamanship
- Engine Maintenance
- The Marine Electrical Systems or completing Marine Electronics 101

- How to Chart seminar or completing Piloting
- Onboard Weather Forecasting seminar or completing Weather
- Using GPS seminar or completing Advanced Piloting
- Using VHF and DSC/VHF Radio seminar or completing Marine Electronics 102

And, an Inland Navigator must also demonstrate on the water skills and the use of fire extinguishers. There are also optional endorsements such as: IW (navigating rivers, dams, and locks), PAD (paddling), and SA (sailing).

Jim Spencer and I have been trained as certifiers. So, we can certify you right here on Lake Champlain as soon as you are ready. If interested in this program please fill out the enclosed survey.

Secondly, we are offering four seminars on the third Tuesday of the months of January, February, March, and April at West Marine from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The seminars are:

- "Using VHF Radio and DSC/VHF Radio" (January)
- "Using GPS" (February)
- "Onboard Weather Forecasting" (March)
- "Boat Handling Under Power" (April)

Again if interested in any of these seminars please fill out the enclosed survey.

Thirdly, we are offering "Seamanship" in May to be followed by "Piloting" in the fall 2007 and "Advanced Piloting" in the spring 2008. In the summer of 2008 we are offering "Sail" 101 and 102. Once again, if interested fill out the survey.

Fourth, we are offering "Instructor Development" or "ID Recertification" in January and February. Fill out the survey if you are interested.

Lastly, all of these courses and programs are contingent on membership interest. So please fill out the enclosed survey. It is very important for you to do so, so we can continue to offer the best for our membership.
