One of Santana Squadron's active and motivating charter members was "Doc Hines." During the organization years, "Doc" was instrumental in the formation of educational classes and policies that was to become Santana Power Squadron. Doc's wife and first mate Lou Hines, was as active as "Doc", and always willing to contribute her time and effort in the organization and growth of the squadron.

Santana Squadron did not have an auxiliary organization of ladies and wives of squadron members, but Lou's contribution and inspiration was the basis for the formation of the *White Caps* in 1965 under the leadership of the charter president Juanita (Nita) Hounsley.

The Lou Hines Memorial Trophy was developed by P/C Leon Navarro as a symbol of recognition for the outstanding active support and assistance by a member of the ladies auxiliary to the auxiliary and the squadron, first presented to Phyllis Robinson, wife of P/C Michael A.G.
