Engaging AgendaAwaits You in Orlando

Did you ever wonder how a National Meeting agenda is developed? It's a relatively simple process that only gets complicated because over 60 people are directly involved in its production!

Annual Meeting agendas provide the day, time and location of all official sessions, open and closed department and committee meetings, seminars, and exhibits. They also provide information for the activities and voter registration desk, Ship's Store, member and social meals, receptions and recognition ceremonies, exhibits and contests, religious services, and host-district displays and activities.

The Annual Meeting agenda is created through a four-step process. The National Meetings Committee (NMC) produces the first draft, based on the agenda from the prior Annual Meeting and inputs from the Board of Directors. The second draft incorporates input from headquarters staff, department and committee chairs and activity coordinators, who review it for completeness and accuracy, with any changes reflected in the third draft. The second draft is a working document used by the NMC chair to coordinate all meeting requirements with the venue hotel (room allocations, configurations and supporting equipment). The third draft reflects these arrangements and provides more information about seminars to be offered. After a final review, proofreading and any late-breaking changes, the final agenda is published and disseminated.

The Annual Meeting agenda is published online on the National Meetings Committee Web page, in the third NMC newsletter (without room assignments) and in the Annual Meeting program distributed at the meeting. It will also be available as an app for your mobile device that will be released just prior to the meeting. Of course, it is possible that unforeseeable on-site changes may be needed to ensure all meeting requirements can be met, in which case the mobile app will be updated and signage provided.

As we prepare for Orlando 2017, we know that an engaging agenda and program of seminars awaits you. Details about Friday seminars will be a topic of our third NMC newsletter. I hope to see you and your squadron-mates in Orlando.

Early Bird Specials End January 9: Make Your Hotel, Meal & Activity Reservations Today

As we go to press, 80% of our block of rooms at the Rosen Centre Hotel has been reserved. Our \$149/night (plus tax) room rate is being honored, subject to room availability, for reservations made by 9 January 2017. To avoid disappointment, please make your reservations on the USPS website or call the Rosen's central reservations office at 1-800-204-7234, and a member of their reservations team will assist you.

When registering for meals and activities, the best way is online. Here's how: On the USPS website (www.usps.org), log onto the Member Site and click on National Meetings in the left-hand menu. (Or go directly there from the public site.) The **Event Reservation** link connects to the "Begin Reservation Process" page. Enter your USPS certificate number and your zip code or PIN number. This will pre-fill your registration form with your member information, making it easier to register for your meals and activities.

You can also call Stephanie Ford at USPS headquarters, 1-888-FOR-USPS (1-888-367-9777). Last-minute reservations may also be made in person at the hotel, *with a \$10 surcharge and subject to availability*. Don't delay: Make your reservations today!

Tuesday, 21 February

0800–1600: SeaWorld Orlando — Come to Florida and see the Sea Life! Sea World Orlando is less than a mile from the hotel. Spend the morning on the "Sea World Behind the Scenes Tour" (75 minutes) then on your own to eat, spend the day in the park and see shows. Ticket price includes the tour and park admission. Shows are included. This includes a guided tour including how they care for rescued manatee and sea turtles, touching sharks and interacting with a penguin. Transportation for this one is **not** included. We will leave the hotel together at approximately 0830, on the Trolley which picks up in front of the Rosen Centre, then return to hotel whenever you like. You may also share a taxi if you don't want to ride on the Trolley. The round trip cost of the Trolley is \$4 for those under age 65 or \$0.50 for those 65 or older. Cash must be used for the Trolley. If any Accessibility needs are required, please notify us at least 4 weeks in advance. Lots of walking involved, so please wear comfortable shoes. **\$118 before 9 January, \$128 after**

- Women: Regulation short-sleeve white blouse with black skirt or slacks, or appropriate attire
- **Evening:** Uniform A with bow tie, USPS blazer with tie, or special occasion evening attire

Friday, 24 February, is devoted to department meetings, free seminars, EXPO exhibits and our teaching aid and youth poster contests.




