SERVICE IS OUR PLEDGE

The Secretary's Department has been very active since our last meeting. The department committees and the Headquarters' staff have been working hard to make the test of Headquarters collection of dues a success, to improve the quality of *THE Ensign* magazine, the Operations Manual, and squadron publications, and to make timely Historian and Flag and Etiquette reports.

Headquarters has finished processing both Voluntary Headquarters Collection and Anniversary Billing (VHQAB) and traditional dues. 19 districts and 210 squadrons representing 27,482 members participated this year in the test of VHQAB. New this year, up to the minute dues status reports and squadron and district deposit reports were available online at www.usps.org/dues/reports. Thanks to the hard work of Headquarters staff and Stf/C John Bradley, SN and R/C Peter Mitchelson, SN, we were able to quickly respond to member requests for enhancements of the status and deposit reports. Also, members were able to make contributions to the Century Fund with their dues payment.

Remember, several thousand members now have anniversary dates other than 1 June. This means these members will receive their renewal notices throughout the year. Squadrons should check their member status reports regularly to ensure these members are contacted and personally asked to renew.

Also, remember that new members in VHQAB squadrons can use a credit card to join. Headquarters sent a supply of special vouchers to participating squadrons in March. Please make sure your Membership Chairman knows about this.

All of the department committees have been busy. Here are some of the highlights. R/C Ina Fay Zitter, JN and The Ensign Committee have been working to help Yvonne Hill, *THE ENSIGN* editor, add content and advertising. R/C Anne Schreitmueller, JN and the Publications Committee are reviewing squadron newsletters and advising editors. PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE

At this time of the year our Publications Committee Advisors are getting ready to file their reports and make recommendations for the Distinction in Journalism award. Our evaluation year ends on 30 September. To be eligible for the DIJ award, our advisor should receive four (4) copies of a squadron newsletter or two (2) copies of a district newsletter BEFORE 30 September.

We have noted an increase in squadron and district publications that are transmitted by e-mail or are posted on websites. This will be the topic of our open meeting at the Portland Governing Board. Plan to join us to hear what squadrons have done and what they have learned from their experience.

We have had several inquiries as to why there was no address in *The Ensign* for sending publications to the Governing Board meeting. This was not an oversight. The *Parade of Publications* is alive and well. But sending publications was costing more and more. Squadrons were paying high postage rates and the Publications Committee was being levied hotel handling charges for each parcel. We encourage you to hand deliver publications or to have someone in your district bring them for you. Please don't send more than 15-20 copies for a Governing Board. For the Annual Meeting we will continue to accept mailed in publications and the address will appear in the December *Ensign*.
