Coop Charting 2017

The United States Power Squadrons[®] is the only organization that routinely and periodically checks the positions of navigational aids. Neither the United States Coast Guard nor the USCG Auxiliary conducts this service. NOAA (*National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration*) relies on individual squadrons to survey and report off station buoys within their local area. This is an important undertaking and civic duty that our squadron performs every year.

We cover all the harbors from Manhasset Bay to Huntington Harbor, and the buoys on the south shore of Long Island Sound between those two harbors. We have boats and skippers ready and willing in each of these harbors to take member volunteers to assist in verifying the positional accuracy of the government aids to navigation. A crew of 3-4 per vessel works well; one to record the latitude and longitude of the buoy being surveyed; one to read off the latitude and longitude from a GPS; skipper to pilot the vessel and the fourth to track the positions from paper charts.

Once the data is collected, the latitude and longitude data is loaded into an excel spread sheet to determine its distance "off station". If it is greater than 150 feet, the information is submitted to NOAA for processing.

In addition, individual squadrons receive recognition and credit for all buoys surveyed and for the number of squadron members are aboard.

SAFETY Report

Little Things Mean a Lot!

As the 2017 summer boating season begins, most of us have successfully put our boats in the water. In fact, BoatU.S. reports that during July 4th holiday weekend, "thousands of recreational boaters will take to the waterways..." making it one of the busiest days on the water not only here on Long Island but all across the country.

As we prepared the boat for launching, we thought about those routine maintenance projects and miscellaneous repairs; including some necessary upgrades and updates; along with planning what gear and provisions go back on the boat for that first ride out after a long winter.

However, don't let the "big" stuff over-shadow the importance of the "little stuff" like: Are your PFDs in good shape? If you use inflatable life vests: Did you manually inflate them and check to see if



they are inflated to the same level after 24 hours? Remember, repairs should be done by an authorized factory representative.

Now is a good time to check your first aid kit. If you used items last year, double check and see what is missing, damaged or out dated. Be prepared by reading over articles about basic first aid or watching a first aid video on what belongs in your first aid kit as a refresher. Check out these two videos:

How about those tubes of sun block you left on the boat from last year. They have expiration dates on them too.



The sun is the number one cause of skin cancer. So make sure you not only have sun block but extra hats, sun glasses and light cover ups for yourself and your guests.

Hopefully, you got a Vessel Safety Check. NO! Well, contact Ron Ferina right away and make an appointment with one of our Vessel Safety Examiners. They will help you keep your boat in tip-top safety shape. Check your flare and fire extinguisher dates. It's a 'little thing' but it will be very important in an emergency if they are out of service because they are too old.

Take a quick look at your air horn. Is the can a bit rusty from years of sitting on the shelf? Will it be okay for another season or is it time to buy a new one? In one 'little' second you can test it to make sure it still works.

Walk around the boat. Are your fenders inflated and firm? They may look good; but flat fenders compressed between your



boat and the dock won't be much help. Speaking of the dock. Are your dock lines in good shape? It only takes a quick minute to look them see if they are frayed/dried out or too

over to see if they are frayed/dried out or too stiff for use.

Whether you're planning on a 4th of July water adventure or just a summer of boating pleasure, take a little time to check out some of these items. You will be happy you did because like the song says, "Little things means a lot."

The Vessel Safety Check Program was developed to serve the recreational boating public. The Oyster Bay Sail and Power Squadron is proud to announce that our Vessel Safety Examiners are ready to visit your boat.

These examiners, recommend the proper safety equipment needed to help keep the boat owner and his crew safe. When all items (on their detailed check list) are found to be in good working order, a decal is awarded and attached to the boat.

Yes, some boaters do fail the check list! All non-complying issues are discussed with the boat owner and suggestions are given to help correct problems including repairs or replacements. A follow-up examine will be scheduled when the vessel is in compliance. Since the USPS is not a law enforcement agency and the report is not shared with anyone outside our organization, boat owners feel a sense of confidence. Schedule a Vessel Safety Exam at your leisure to determine if your vessel is in compliance with current regulations.
