Harry pretty much grew up on the water. Summers were spent on the family's waterfront camp on the Saint John's River in Jacksonville, Florida. He began boating at age 12 and has been an active boater for many years. First in a 12 foot pram, then a 20 foot Clinker built runabout then on two Navy Aircraft Carriers as he sailed the Mediterranean and Gulf of Tonkin seas during his twenty years of service as a Navy Photographer. He was awarded two "Teacher of the Year" awards while assigned to the Navy Schools of Photography in Pensacola, Florida. Following retirement from the Navy, he graduated from the University of West Florida with degrees in computer science. He taught one year as a graduate student and one year full time. He received a Teacher of the Year award from the Data Processing Management Association during his association with the University. But then it was off to his hobbies including Scuba Diving, Amateur Radio and boating where there were runabouts, jet skis and now a kayak.

His interest in boating and education led to his joining the Squadrons in 1992. He dug in and completed Seamanship, Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Junior Navigation, and well the rest of the courses necessary to complete his Full Certificate in three years. After a year in the squadron, he began teaching courses. Three years later he had taught all five advanced grade as well as all six required elective courses. While serving as first Squadron Educational Officer and then as Squadron Commander of the Pensacola squadron, he also served as Assistant District Educational Officer and was a member of the USPS Navigation Committee writing and grading examinations and sight folders. At the 2000 USPS Annual Meeting, he was awarded the Charles F. Chapman Award for Excellence in Teaching for his service to the Educational Departments of USPS. He was an aide to C/C Les Johnson, SN, for two years.

He was elected to the D/15 Bridge and served as Administrative and Executive Officer as well as Commander. During his year as D/15 Commander, he made 86 squadron visits visiting each of the District's twelve squadrons at least five times and co-hosted the 2003 Governing Board in New Orleans providing the administrative arm for event reservations. At that Governing Board and not having enough to do, he volunteered for and was selected to be a member of the Operations Manual Committee. He accepted the job of editor of the manual, a position he holds to this day. He served as both the Staff and Chair of the OM committee.

Just when things looked like they might slow down a little, he was offered the position of Assistant National Secretary and now National Secretary. As a life member of USPS, National Secretary, Pensacola's squadron treasurer, webmaster, computer secretary and learning to navigate his kayak, et cetera (you get the idea), there is little time for anything but service to the United States Power Squadrons, America's Boating Club. Guess what, he likes it that way.

Note to All Squadron Commanders

In accordance with the District bylaws, I will email each Squadron Commander a request for the names of the delegates from your squadron for the conference.

Each Squadron Commander is a delegate, as are the District Bridge, Chairs of the Nominating, Rules and Audit Committees, and Past District Commanders in attendance. In addition, squadron Commanders can name additional delegates to represent their squadron based on their total membership as of March 1st. These delegates are voting members for the conference.

The number of delegates for each squadron are listed below:

Banana River—Commander plus 3 delegates

Central Florida—Commander plus 3 delegates

Cocoa Beach—Commander plus 7 delegates

Daytona Beach—Commander plus 3 delegates

Gainesville—Commander plus 3 delegates

Harris Chain—Commander plus 2 delegates

Jacksonville—Commander plus 5 delegates

I will ask that Commanders return their list of delegates to me by October 12th (one week prior to the conference).

While all members attending the conference are encouraged to ask questions, raise concerns and take part in discussions during the Business Meeting, only named delegates will be able to vote. At the beginning of the Business Meeting at 2:00 pm, I will take a roll call of all named delegates to determine the number of voting members in attendance.

Thank you also to Christine Zahornacky of Daytona Beach for sharing these pictures with us!










