The final exam will be given at the end of the day and after passing the exam the student will receive the Hartford Power Squadron's Certificate attesting to the passing of the NASBLA test which can be used in any State to apply for a License or Certificate to operate a power boat.

February Member Meeting Program Featured Rhea Drozdenko "Protecting Clean Water, Restoring Health Rivers".

Rhea Drozdenko of the Connecticut River Conservancy (CRC) gave us a talk on their efforts to maintain a healthy Connecticut River all the way from the top of New Hampshire to the Sound. CRC has offices and staff in all four states touching the river.

The CRC was founded in 1952 and has been a strong advocate for the river as well as actively monitoring and cleaning up the river. Among its current chief concerns are water quality and invasive species.

Its quality initiatives include monitoring for sewage, excessive nutrients, micro plastics, PFAS, and pesticides. It has especially been active in advocating for cities to separate their sewage from their street runoff. When these are combined into the same sewage system, excessive rainfall can force the city to release any overflow into the CT river resulting in obvious sewage pollution of the river.

Its Clean Up initiatives include an annual clean up in September with volunteers cleaning banks and removing some invasive species. She described two invasive species that they are seeing a lot more of:

Water Chestnuts and Hydrilla. Both can grow up to 20' from the floor of the river or lake and produce dense foliage at the top that some boats cannot even power through. In the case of the Hydrilla, the long vines can become entangled in our props.

One of their current advocacy efforts is to establish a 'Paddle Trail' which would join overnight camping sites along the river so that paddlers could traverse long lengths of the river much like hiking the Appalachian Trail.
