Annual Report of the Commander

With the COVID Virus now being in the wake behind the stern of our boats, the Hartford Power Squadron had a great, activity packed, year. Our Change of Watch Dinner was well attended regardless of our entertainer, singer Tony Riccio, having to cancel due to illness.

Our biggest accomplishment of the year was the successful holding of our First Annual BoatShow /Swap Meet at the Westbrook Outlets and our First Annual All Cash Raffle. Both events went off very smoothly and netted our Squadron a profit of approx. \$600. Although it was a small profit, this was the first year of the event so there were initial set up expenses not to recur in the future.

Our Executive Department's Co-Operative Charting efforts did not go unnoticed by National. We held our Coop Charting event on June 11, 2022. Our Squadron was ranked 8th in the country, and seven of our members received individual awards for their actions. Great job, guys.

Immediate Past Commander Timothy Tyler once again hosted our ExCom meeting/outing in August at the Ragged Rock Marina. Dr Mitch Wagener gave an excellent presentation on Climate Change at our September member meeting.

On Saturday, September 17th, we hosted a combined 90th Anniversary Party for both our Squadron and the Middletown Squadron, at the Middlesex Yacht Club in Chester, with Steve Kauslaskas, Echoes of Sinatra, as our entertainment.

On Sunday Sept 25th we entered a Float in the Bristol Mum Festival Parade. We didn't win a prize, but we got our name out in front of over 25,000 people.

Our Squadron helped host a wonderful District Christmas party at Campagna's Restaurant in December, featuring some Amazing Magic & Comedy with Jim Sisti.

The Hartford Boat Show at the Mohegan Sun was back again this year & we secured a Complimentary Booth from the CMTA. It was a busy show & we distributed over 300 flyers on our upcoming Boat Show/Swap meet, ABC classes, CPR class, & Member meetings to the hundreds of people who stopped by.

At our January member meeting we hosted a Trivia Contest with Steve Petty; and our February Member meeting featuring NBC Meteorologist Darren Sweeney doing a presentation on weather forecasting was cancelled due to weather.

The Secretary's Department received awards for all our publications, provided accurate and timely meeting minutes, and once again kept our histories 100% up to date.

The Treasurer's Department performed all its responsibilities in a timely fashion, arranged for our (successful) yearly audit.

I would like to thank all our members and especially the Executive Committee who have supported the Squadron & me throughout the past year. You are the ones that make the Hartford Power Squadron the great organization it is today.

Annual Report of the Treasurer

This year we continued all of the policies instituted in the last two years for the accounting and finances of the Hartford Power Squadron. Among these, we:

- 1. We were able to purchase several 5 year CDs at favorable rates due to the increase of the Fed rates.
- 2. Contributed to the National Education Fund for the 24th year.,
- 3. Prepared a draft budget for the Executive Committee at the January, February, and March meetings and submitted for approval to the Annual Meeting on 28 March, 2023.
- 4. Paid our State of CT sales tax for course manual sales in a timely manner.
- 5. Filed the CT Secretary of State Annual Report in a timely manner.
- 6. Filed the IRS 990-N for non-profits in a timely manner.
- 7. Met with our auditor, Ted Wurz, P. His report is included with the Officer Reports below

The results for this year were unusually poor with a net loss for the year of \$1,796.22 on income of \$7.424/98 and expenses of \$9,221.20. This was primarily due to the over budget expense of our 90th Anniversary Party. It contributed \$1,581.14 to the net loss. There were additional over budget expenses including adding to our Ship's Store inventory and entertainment at the Holiday Party. These were almost completely balanced by the profit of the Boat Show and Swap Meet and a large increase in CD interest.

I would like to thank the Executive Committee for its support of my efforts and thank Ted Wurz for his efforts as our auditor.

The end of year Financial Statement and Balance sheet have been submitted to the Executive Committee and are available to any member wanting to review them.

Hartford Power Squadron Report of the Audit Committee

March 9, 2023

To the Members of the Hartford Power Squadron

At the request of the Commander, the internal audit committee completed an internal audit of the financial statements and controls of the Hartford Power Squadron for the year ended February 28, 2023.

The audit concluded that receipts and expenditures were properly accounted for, cash accounts were properly reconciled, and that the financial statements reflect the results as presented. We also found that federal and state filings were up to date, and that accounts with National are regularly balanced and accounted for.

We note that the Squadron operated at a large loss this year of \$1,796.22. This was primarily due to the excess expenditures of \$1,581.14 for the Squadron's 90th Anniversary. Those expenses were approved by the Executive Committee. We recommend that efforts continue to look for opportunities to continue on a break-even/profit basis year to year.

"Sailing her home to CT"

Our Sailing journey 1870 miles through the water from Punta Gorda, FL to Westbrook, CT by Rob & Paula Goldstein

After sailing his family's O'Day 27 for many years, Rob & Paula purchased a used Hunter 45 on the west coast of Florida. To get it home, he sailed and motored in both the ICW (Intercoastal Waterway) and offshore to bring her to her new home port in Westbrook, CT: 1,870 miles over 25 days.
