Address Service Requested



At the September Members Meeting, a great Presentation was given by Darren Sweeney, Channel 4 Weatherman and Associate Professor, Dept of Journalism, Central Connecticut State University.

Darren explained some of the basics of weather forecasting: look at what's coming and what just happened. He explained that cloud formations can help the boater look for danger, especially the high 'anvil' shaped cloud that can create high winds.

He explained that each National Weather Service facility releases two weather balloons per 24 hours that give temperature, pressure, and wind speeds. These are then used by the major 'models' to help forecast the upcoming weather. He said the 'European' model has some advantages over the 'American' model in that it has been updated more, but either can be wrong.

He suggested that there are problems with 'messaging' for today's weather forecasting in that there is a lot of disinformation and poor information on social media. He urged everyone to stick with the established weather forecasting outlets.
