#### AT LAST, A FULL-TIME TV DESTINATION FOR ALL THINGS BOATING!

In the middle of April, Sue Kuemmel & I were invited to participate in the public launch of America's Boating Channel's expanded television service at the International Boating and Water Safety Summit, held in Little Rock AR for four days. To give you an idea of the significance of this conference, USPS was represented by the current Chief Commander Craig Fraser, the past Chief Commander Mary Paige Abbott, and past Chief Commander Robert Baldridge. Other organizations which supported the conference were the Executive Directors of American Canoe Association, National Association of State Boating Law Administrators, National Safe Boating Council, Sea Tow Foundation, The Corps Foundation (USACE), Water Sports Foundation, and more.

Most of us were aware that America's Boating Channel produces boater education and boating safety videos, which were then shown on YouTube. Now this service has been enormously expanded by including several hundred more videos produced by the other organizations, in an

unprecedented collaboration among fellow U.S. Coast Guard non-profit grant recipients, now shown as a free-of-charge video-on-demand (VOD) and as a continuously-playing streaming TV channel. We can now access all of this via a Roku stick or FireTV app.

These services also mark the media industry's first-ever full-time television presence totally devoted to all things boating. Cable TV already offers full-time golf, tennis, and skiing channels – and now at last, boating.

# America's Boating Channel Launches on Smart TV

#### **USPS Chief Commander Presses Button at IBWSS Ceremony**

Little Rock, AR, 16 April 2023 – **America's Boating Channel**<sup>™</sup>, the U.S. Coast Guard funded boating safety and boater education video service, produced by United States Power Squadrons® (USPS), publicly launched its new smart TV offerings this afternoon during the opening ceremony of the International Boating & Water Safety Summit (IBWSS).

The red-carpet gala event celebrated a collaboration among numerous Coast Guard non-profit grantees who contributed several hundred **boating safety and boater education videos** to the new services and marked a **first for the media industry which has never before had a fulltime television destination for all-things-boating**. The services also feature boat fails, boating news, boat races, boating TV program series, movies for boaters, boating cartoons, and other high-appeal boating themed television programs.

In announcing the launch, America's Boating Channel's Grant Project Manager Marty Lafferty thanked the people who made it possible... USPS Chief Commander **Craig Fraser** appeared center stage to press the button that officially marked the launch of the **America's Boating Channel on-demand app on Roku and FireTV, and continuously playing live channel on Sports.TV.** 

Lafferty went on to say, "Tonight signals the start of the first phase of our commercial operation. Our focus now turns entirely to our viewing audience. Together we will make our constituents aware of these new smart TV

services, invite them to subscribe for free, and encourage them to tune-in and spread the word far and wide. **America's Boating Channel is now truly the next best thing to being on the water**."

#### Minutes from April 4, 2023 Meeting

#### **Wolftever Clubhouse**

The meeting was held at Wolftever Clubhouse on April 4, 2023, following a scrumptious potluck dinner and social hour. Thanks to the Flasnicks for hosting this gathering, to Sue Kuemmel for picking up the chicken dishes, and to everyone for their delicious pot luck donations. The meeting was called to order at 6:20 pm by CDR John Cook.

The process by which the boat that was donated to the Squadron in 2022 was sold, was reviewed by Norm Oien and Jack Everett. As reported on previously, several Squadron members donated their time and skills to prepare the boat for sale, including Rick Booth, John DiPrima, Norm Oien, Jack Everett, and Sue Kuemmel! A huge thank you to all involved in this endeavor! The boat was sold for \$4,500, to be used by the Squadron for supporting its goal to encourage safe and fun boating in our area.

Jack Everett announced that Vessel Safety Check brochures are available for Squadron members to distribute at their local marinas, and that Sue Kuemmel has them for electronic distribution through email, etc. Members are encouraged to distribute them as we gear up for the upcoming boating season.

Greg Golian reviewed the training opportunities the Squadron is supporting. This includes an ABC class on April 22, (which he subsequently reported that 100% of the 21 students passed)! Thx to Sue & Jim Kuemmel, Jack Everett and of course Greg for their help with that course.

The Marine Navigation course, which replaces Piloting, is offered online as a beta course. Interest in advanced classes has been running pretty low this year, both for members and nonmembers, so all are encouraged to take advantage of the superb courses being offered to expand our collective state of knowledge. Norm Oien reminded us of the Knoxville Squadron's plans to be in this area during May. As of the time of the meeting, the only firm information is a Knoxville Lock Thru, May 14, with their Squadron ending their voyage in Chattanooga. If members are interested in meeting with the Knoxville Squadron boats making this trek, please reach out to Norm, Jack Everett or Sue Kuemmel to coordinate.

Sue Kuemmel provided an update on our Squadron's progress to sponsor a Sea Scout Ship (the equivalent to a troop), which is open to both boys and girls. A Skipper has been identified to lead this group, with 8-10 Scouts interested. Jack Everett will be the Charter Organization Representative and interface with the Council for our group. Sue will be Chair of the Advisory Committee for the Ship and several Squadron members will sit on the board, including Jim Kuemmel, Greg Golian, and potentially others. There was ABC support at the National meeting for this partnership. The Ship will decide on their goals and our Squadron members will meet with this group and will encourage the Scouts to take ABC courses at the member rate. Squadron members involved will need to do some additional training, and must join the Sea Scouts organization. A motion was made and seconded for our Squadron to pay the Sea Scout dues for 4-5 Squadron members to support their involvement in sponsoring this Ship. Steve Flasnick indicated he would be happy to be a sponsor if allowed by the ABC by-laws. All Squadron members are encouraged to share ideas on our involvement with this Sea Scout Ship.

John DiPrima provided a review of the Hiwassee River Blueway Council, which "...provides opportunities for recreation, conservation, river stewardship, tourism, economic development and education, while striving to preserve the natural, historic and cultural resources along the Hiwassee River, its tributaries and adjoining communities...". Jack Vincent is a long-time member of our Squadron, and his daughter, Nancy Watt, is currently the Council's Executive Director. The Council is in the process of applying for non-profit status. The group's major fund-raising event is a June 24, 2023 Rail to River weekend event, which the Council is recruiting sponsors for. A motion was made and seconded for the Squadron to donate \$250 to promote and preserve the Hiwassee River. Squadron members are encouraged to participate in the event (<u>https://www.eventbrite.com/e/hiwassee-blueway-rail-to-river-paddle-event-tickets-598844218177</u>). During this annual fundraiser event, "...attendees will enjoy a scenic train ride on the Hiwassee Rail to the put-in and a 5-mile paddle on the Hiwassee River from Reliance to Delano, TN. Inflatable kayaks are available from Webb Bros and inflatable stand up paddle boards from Outshine Adventures. Paddlers can participate with their own paddle crafts as long as they are rated for Class I whitewater. The main paddle event will end with a catered meal and live music at Fireside Outpost...". (Quotes from the Hiwassee River Blueway Council documents.)

Sue Kuemmel reiterated that the Boating Channel has cancelled plans to film in our area this year, but they have assured us that we are first on the list for next year's videos. They had so many volunteer Clubs this year that they went ahead and completed filming before coming here. They have also assumed the major sponsorship for the International Boating and Water Safety Summit (IBWSS) in April, which Sue & Jim Kuemmel will be attending as staff members for The Boating Channel.

Sue also reviewed the following events which our Squadron will be involved with:

- a) 2 May 2023 Squadron meeting at Kummels' house (3001 Stage Run Drive, Hixson), with a pork loin dinner (\$8/pp). Wine to share as well as appetizers are encouraged.
- b) 7 May 2023 Blessing of the Fleet with interested Squadron boats encouraged to meet by the cliffs near Big Ridge Marina for a 1 pm start.

- c) 20 May 2023 Erwin Customer Appreciation picnic we will have an information booth and Vessel Safety Checks will be available. Squadron members are encouraged to contact Sue Kuemmel to volunteer to help with this at Erwin Marina, 3001 Kings Point Road, Chattanooga.
- d) 21-26 May 2023 is National Safe Boating Week and Sue is looking for volunteers to handout safe boating information to boat launchers.

The Squadron is proud to announce our newest Life Member – Tom Street, who is our competent Treasurer. Thanks so much, Tom, for this lifelong commitment!

Carol Fairfield thanked Pam Trotter for assuming the Secretarial responsibilities, including composing the March C-Way and attending Squadron meetings while Carol was out of the state. Thanks Pam!
