The eleventh of twelve videos in the new series, <u>NAVIGATING LOCKS</u>, will premiere on Fire TV, Roku, AmericasBoatingChannel.com, and YouTube, as well as Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and other social networks at **8 PM EDT on Sunday September 10.**

NAVIGATING LOCKS covers preparations that boaters should make prior to passing though locks. Viewers will learn steps to take upon arriving at and entering a lock. Also featured are tips for securing vessels as water levels changes in locks, the role lock operators play, and how to safely exit from locks.

The 'Pinta,' a replica of a Portuguese Caravel used by Columbus and many early explorers will open as a "floating museum" and be docked at the Chattanooga Pier from November 3-20.

The Pinta was launched in Brazil after 3 years of construction in 2005. Her original version was the first ship to sight land on the famous voyage of October 12th, 1492.

Dockside, educational tours will be available, as will self-guided tours from 9:00am-5:00pm daily while the vessel is in Chattanooga. No reservations are necessary. Tickets are purchased at the ship and prices are \$8.00 for adults, \$7.00 for seniors/military (65+), and \$6.00 for children (5 - 16). Children 4 and under are free.

Teachers or organizations wishing to schedule a 30-minute guided tour with a crew member during the weekdays should go to ninapinta.org/tour/html. Group tours require a minimum of 15 people.

Try the unique guided experience of locking through Chickamauga Dam from the seat of a kayak. You will paddle into the 120 ft tall lock and the massive gates will close behind you.

Your guide will connect the boats to a moving anchor at the side of the lock to secure all of the passengers on the trip. The lock-master slowly empties the water in the lock from Chickamauga Lake into the Tennessee River below the dam.

As the water empties the lock, you slowly descend into the depth of the lock to match the river level below the dam. The massive doors in front of you open and your guide will lead you into the river where the paddling adventure continues on the Tennessee River with the mild current helping us navigate downstream.

This is a truly unique Chattanooga kayaking experience.
