Boating Under the Influence: Talk about it before it's too late

Let's talk about boating under the influence (BUI). Just because November is upon us and a lot of boats have been winterized, we continue to need to educate each other about this dangerous practice. America's Boating Channel[™] BUI videos offer an excellent way in which to do this.



Check out the "Dispelling BUI Myths" video in Season

Four that covers six major misconceptions about boating under the influence (BUI). It teaches viewers about unique dangers associated with boating while intoxicated and features law enforcement actions and penalties for conviction of BUI. In Season Five there is a video entitled "BUI Fatalities" that covers the most fundamental reason for not boating under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Viewers will learn of additional associated risks and receive tips for avoiding BUI, such as using a designated sober operator.

Hello from Admin,

Looks like we're finally getting into fall. The trees on the mountains and ridges are finally showing off their colors. I've been cleaning up the garden and planting some winter crops, and my Thanksgiving Cactus has finally set buds for their annual show. Jim mowed the yard for what we hope is the last time this year and we've been trimming some of the bushes and weeding the flower beds. This is the first stretch of days that the weather has been cool enough to get outside and actually get something done before the holidays set in.

I do have a few things to bring to you this month, the first and foremost being our annual collection for Samaritan Center. The Center will not sponsor a "Gift Shop" this year. They are seeing more need in the areas of budgetary expenditures. They have been providing weekend "Pack Sacks" for school children, providing school supplies for teachers and students, and helping the homeless through the McClellan Shelter and renters through their rent program. In addition to supporting an increasing monthly Food Box program, the area has had an influx of immigrants who need financial counselling and monetary support. All this at a significantly increased cost due to inflation has significantly impacted their budget. So, this year we are asking member NOT to bring \$20 gifts, but to consider bringing a CHECK for \$20 (or more), made out to the Squadron, which we can then donate to the Center. Tom will collect the money at the meeting and then write a check to the Center.

I also want to remind everyone about the Veterans' Day Parade in Ft. Oglethorpe, on Saturday, November 11th, starting at 2pm on Battlefield Parkway. We would like to invite members who would like to help or ride in the parade to get in touch with me or Glynn Pope for more information. Lloyd Hensley who was formerly a member (and Marine), has volunteered his boat for the parade and will pull it with his truck during the parade.

Finally, I want to invite everyone to come to the Chili Supper Cookoff on Tuesday, November 7th, from 5 – 7pm, at Privateer Yacht Club. As I write this, we have so far just three cooks, but are hoping to add a few more. Cost is \$7/person; cooks are free (one per family), and we will have prizes! There is a new course coming out called Offshore Navigation that will replace the old Jr. Navigation course. It will focus on electronic navigation using Open-CPN and a user-friendly program called Visual Passage Planner 2. Like the old course there will be a practice cruise and an exam, but there will not be any celestial sights as part of this course (all the celestial navigation will be consolidated into one course). From what I know of it this should be a really good course. The Open-CPN program is also used in the Marine Navigation and Advanced Marine Navigation courses, as we transition our focus from paper charts to electronics based navigation.

Each year we train 100-150 new boaters in safe boating practices. Anyone have interest in helping out with this effort? If you might like to teach, or help out with class administration, let's talk!

USPS/ABClubs Governing Board Meeting, Kansas City:

As the Rear Commander and Chair for the Environmental Committee of ABClubs I conducted two environmental workshops at the meeting, I'll briefly highlight the high points of each workshop herein. First, I sought input from attendees regarding how to make the most effective use of the 25 authorized committee members on the national Environmental Committee. After considerable review and discussion, it was recommended that I designate each of the 25 committee members to be responsible as national environmental liaison between the committee and a specific district, but not the district in which they reside.

I am in the process of setting up this system. Come to my workshop in Orlando in February how this works out!

The other workshop was a power point presentation involving participants input on how to be "good stewards" of the environment as active ABClub boaters in the marine environment. It was well received with good input from all that attended.

One other environmental note of current interest: I have asked our Sea Scout coordinators to join us in a local waterway "clean up" this spring. More to come on this; I hope to involve a good number of our members to participate in a local water way clean up activity as a way of getting us involved in getting to better know and help them to have some actual hands-on activity with us as a club.

Finally, I hope to begin a relationship with others starting this weekend at Harrison Bay State Park boat ramp off Highway 58 from 9 a.m. until noon with various sponsors and initiated by Sunshine Tours. They provide all the gear. I hope we can be a sponsor with them for another event in the Spring!

Minutes October 3, 2023 Meeting Privateer Yacht Club, Hixson, TN

- a) The Nominating Committee met on October 23 to suggest nominations to fill the Bridge and Committee positions for 2024.
