Hello All,

We are planning to present our basic introductory class (America's Boating Course) two or three times this spring and we are offering the TWRA certification class at least three times as well. So, our teachers will be busy this year, especially if we present additional Boat Handling classes for the Ship mates. Several of the boys will be attending our first ABC program March 9th. If you would like to help with one of the classes, we could use help with check-in and/or grading, Please let Greg, Sue, Jim or Jack if you are able to help for one of the classes.

When we lay out the schedule for the year, I hope to include a few Saturday (afternoon) meetings, and I would like to alternate the day of the week for some of the meetings so we can better include those who cannot meet on certain days of the week. Our first educational activity for the new year is showing our boating simulator demo at the boat show, in hope that it will help attract folks to our booth and maybe result in some new interest in our club.

Our first ABC class is set for Saturday March 9, 9 AM - 5 PM, in Hixson. 


