

The instructors for this class cruised the Bahamas and Caribbean while living aboard their 37' Pacific Seacraft sailboat for 7 years. They have also made several transits of the Panama Canal and sailed the Pacific Coast from Mexico to Southern California as well as sailing the Atlantic East Coast between Maine and Florida. 
