
### 2021 Cooperative Charting Recap

## America's Boating Club - Geodetic Safety Vests

These vests help to keep you safe when near the road as you explore for Geodetic markers. Remember that this is one of our important activities to satisfy one side of our USPS triangle, Civic Service.

We are aiding NGS in their effort to identify and ascertain the status of the many Geodetic markers all around the country.

When wearing the safety vest, it helps to make sure you stay safe but it also helps promote USPS/Americas Boating Club when someone questions what you're doing, this gives you a great talking point.

The cost for these vests is \$35 plus shipping (sizes 2X and 3X are \$2 more). These vests come with zippered front and pockets.

Right now, there are 2 Large and 3 XL ready for immediate shipment. I also have 17 more transfers that can be converted in a very short time.

## America's Boating Club - Geodetic **Magnetic Car Signs**

When you are parked along a roadway or other locations conducting geodetic mark recoveries, these signs are very helpful in letting the public know that we are there on official business. They identify who we are and what we are doing. Sometimes you may be parked in a questionable location. With these signs, most individuals and even law enforcement do not question what you are doing. If they do inquire, they tend to be understanding and supportive.

As with the vests, these signs also help promote USPS/America's Boating Club and the civic service activity that we provide to NGS. The signs are typically placed on the driver side car door, and another one can be placed on the passenger side door. Placement on the rear of the car is another option if there is room for it.

These signs are provided at cost. The 10" X 20" magnetic signs are just \$20 plus shipping. Shipping within continental U.S. is: 1 sign \$12, 2-3 signs \$16, 4-6 signs \$20. For shipping of more signs or to other locations, please enquire.
