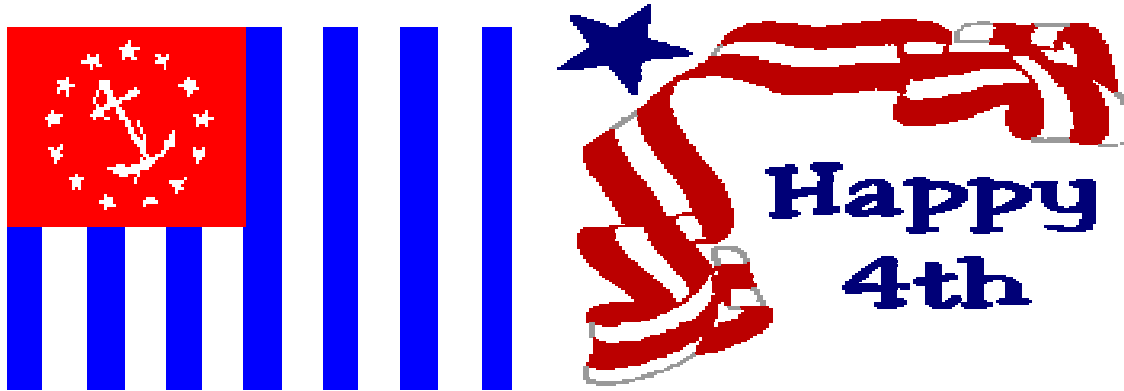

The Cruise Planning continued through the month with several additional students.

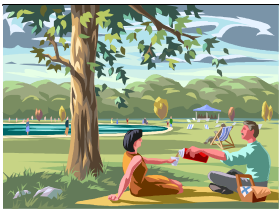
