In previous reports in the 45th Parallel, the details regarding Spring course dates and venues were provided. Since one of them is being offered by our squadron through Zoom and the rest are being offered through NMC which has instituted a new website for Extended Education classes, I thought that the following review might be helpful in accessing online information and registering for the classes.

There are three classes being offered through NMC and in-person. They are Cruising and Cruise Planning, Sailing, and the College for Kids version of America's Boating Course. For these, go to nmc.augusoft.net (not .edu). Since Cruising and Cruise Planning has already started, there will be information on the website but you will need to contact instructors Tom Stone or Bill Bailey to register. For all of them, after accessing the website, go to "Recreation" to find the courses.

In the same way, you will find the virtual (adult) version of America's Boating Course which is being offered through NMC's LiveStream (their version of Zoom) in May.

The Boat Handling Course and Seminars is different. It is being offered directly by us via Zoom rather than through NMC. Go to <u>gtbayboating.org</u> to find a description of Boat Handling and a registration form to mail in. This course is the new version of Seamanship; for members of Grand Traverse Bay, completing the course and passing the exam leads to the grade of "S".

Pizza served at 6:00 p.m.


