
At the USPS annual meeting in Orlando Florida, they asked the membership to support the USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Check Program. They also asked USPS to increase the number of inspectors and increase the number of boats inspected by 20% this year. Last year GTBay had 66 inspections, Arnold Taddia – 6, Gene Van Rhee – 8, Shirley Van Rhee – 31, and Jerry Williams – 21.

With over 860 marina slips in Grand Traverse Bay, we need some help. This is a great program that allows you to see many different boats and visit with the operators of these boats. - 1. All of the students in the Cruise and Cruise Planning class passed. The lowest score was 95. the highest score was 100. That says a lot about the instruction as well as about the students. And the instructional materials. The new Cruise and Cruise Planning materials are vastly better than those that proceeded them.
- 2. I have had an interesting experience in finding out what the real facts are. At the SEO meeting during the D9 meeting last weekend it was announced that the Birmingham Squadron had been awarded \$750 for holding and reporting having held meetings of classes at a certain place. My first thought was that was really important. I thought I should look into this because, since we have a lot of classes, it might be a great way to harvest money easily. I shared this with Jerry and he thought it would be worth looking into. My next step was to check this out on the national site.

Here is what I found out. This is a quotation from the February 2015 national meeting minutes.

"Ole Riise, Brunswick Corp. director of financial services, assisted by Stf/C John Miller, JN, presented awards to the top three squadrons that held the most classes at Brunswick dealerships in 2014.

Silver – Lakeland/22, \$500 Gold – Charlotte/27, \$750 Platinum – Pittsburgh/7, \$1,000"

I have some questions about this: 1. what is a Brunswick dealership? 2. Does that mean any bowling alley or sports shop that sells Brunswick bowling balls? 3. Do we have a "Brunswick dealership" in our area?

The bottom line is even if there is a Brunswick dealership in our area, I think our relationship with NMC is better than any connection with a local Brunswick dealership because we are getting more publicity with NMC and any Brunswick dealer could give us. Further, what Brunswick dealership could give us better instructional facilities that NMC? I think this is another example of the notion that all that glitters is not gold.

- 3. The schedule of classes and seminars that I shared with you last month is proceeding. Next month I will share what we know about enrollments at that time. My guess is that there may not be a lot of information at that time except for sailing. I have confidence that we will have good results
- 4. To ensure that will be the case I will be upgrading our processes for contacting local news sources and will work with the two members, Guy Leslie and Dave Millross, who have agreed to help out with publicity on this issue.



SAFETY OFFICERS REPORT

Pre-Launch Concerns: Funky Fuel & Funky Lines

Two issues invariably manifest themselves for many boaters upon or shortly after spring launch: fuel and lines, but not the same subject. We are talking fuel tanks and dock lines. Sitting idle for the winter in generally unfriendly conditions is hard on fuel systems and dock lines. Dock lines frequently emerge from storage exhibiting extreme stiffness and possibly mold or algae growth, while fuel tanks may present less-obvious but potentially more serious problems.

When docking upon launch, it's pretty difficult to safely secure a boat in a slip with lines that won't hold a knot or stay put on a cleat. If the lines are generally in good shape, proper cleaning can save many dollars over buying new lines. What has happened inside a fuel tank during the winter is much less obvious and potentially more dangerous. An engine that stalls in open water is an inconvenience, but a stalled engine when docking or approaching a bridge can have immediate and catastrophic results. Virtually every fuel tank acquires some water over the winter lay-up, either from condensation or from leaking filler cap o-rings. Either water alone or sludge from bacterial action and fuel breakdown can clog filters, usually at the most inconvenient time! 
