SMALL BOATS RULE

I recently came across my unread copy of BoatU.S. Magazine September/October 2022 while looking for some reading material to take on our recent (and too brief) trip to Beaver Island. In it, there was an article titled "America is a small boat nation" that contained some interesting ownership data from 2020. That year, there were approximately 12-million boats registered in the US. Of those, 95% (11.4-million) were less than 26 feet in length. Also in 2020, just over 1-million used boats changed hands and 320,000 new boats were sold.

Aside from the obvious lower purchase cost of boats under 26-feet, one of the great benefits of smaller boat ownership is their relative simplicity compared to larger craft. Simpler systems means fewer things to go wrong, easier maintenance and surprise repair bills that won't bank-rupt you. In spite of their size, small boats mean big fun for people of all ages, but particularly for the family of modest means. How many of you have precious memories involving youth, water and a boat?

My point is this: These statistics reinforce the importance of targeting the owners of "small boats" for our education program, and community outreach to those million-plus new-to-them boat owners each year. It's time for squadron education programs to begin once again. Our efforts will help to ensure that those precious memories are good ones!


