TRSPS Paddlers Share Friendship and Fun on Lake Rico



On May 21st, members of Taunton River Sail & Power Squadron met for their first paddling event of the season. Ken Amaral, Michele, Rick Lewis along with Paul and Eric Messier arrived at the launch site 10:00 AM. Two canoes and two kayaks entered the water at 10:30. After checking that everyone had the proper safety equipment the paddlers headed leisurely south into the main area of the lake. Lake Rico is one of several bodies of water in Massasoit State Park in Taunton, MA.



A popular fishing and hiking area the Park has a varied assortment of wildlife. Paddling west along the shoreline a great blue heron was suddenly flew out of a cove northwest of Stall Hill Island. Later an osprey flew over to check things out. It is unlikely that the paddlers were of any particular interest to the osprey. With clear water and light weed cover the bass, pickerel were visible from the boats. The nests of blue gills were hollowed out of the gravel bottom. Michele tried her hand at a little fishing and managed to catch a couple of small bass.

After cruising along the shoreline for a while exploring the many inlets the group decided that it was time for lunch. Crossing the lake to the eastern shore they found a small vacant beach that suited the purpose perfectly. After a short break we continued

southeast along the shore. The wind, while not uncomfortable, was sufficient propulsion to make paddling almost unnecessary. There would of course be a price to pay on the return trip. Once again the blue heron took flight.



It was at this point that Commander Ken's dog Harris decided it was time to take a swim. He had been riding comfortably in the front of Ken's kayak up to this point. After a brief down into Kings Pond the paddlers returned to the launch site wrapping things up by 2:00. A nice first outing that was enjoyed by all.
