

The Chief Commander's message, given by Ken Grilling, emphasized, as you might expect, public education and membership. 

- 1) 0900: Start of FREE Vessel Safety Checks until 1300
- 2) AmeriSafe will be on site to service vessel and home fire extinguishers.
- 3) 1100 and 1300: Live, on-site, use of a fire extinguisher to put out an actual fire
- 4) 1130 and 1330: Experience firing a 12 gauge flare gun and lighting a hand-held flare.
