

Where in the world is your *Bullhorn* Editor?

Ernie & Kathy arrived at the City of Ft. Myers, FL Yacht Basin on schedule January 15, 2020. It was a very interesting adventure that required a lot of attention to details in many of the creeks, rivers and canals along the Atlantic ICW route. The canal locks (one in Virginia and 5 in Florida) proved to be locations where you really needed to be "on your game". The lock at Great Bridge, VA is a 1 - 2 foot difference and easy to navigate. For locks 2, 3 & 4 in FL, 2 & 4 were open and 3 was only a 2-foot change. Locks 1 & 5 however were 13-foot changes and was a challenge therewith. Lines were provided at all the Florida locks for you to use and all you needed to do was either let out or take up the slack with engines and radar turned off. The other challenges was being able to stay in the channel with limited visibility in heavy rain and some zig-zags through narrow areas with real close attention being paid through Georgia. All in all, it was a great trip.
